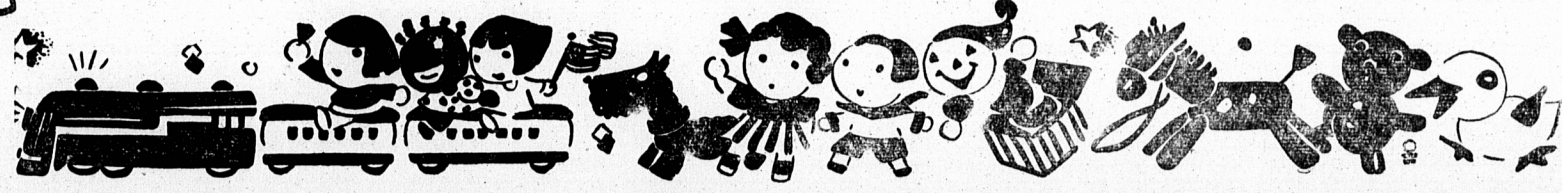

HALIFAX, Nov. 19—Unemployment and relief problems of Nova Scotia were aired today in a conference of town and municipal relief officers here under auspices of the Dalhousie University Institute of Public Affairs.

Lectures and papers by Dalhousie professors and Government labor officials reviewed Nova Scotia's relief situation of the past and present, and open discussion brought out suggestions for the future.

Relief was pictured as a paradox forcing the problem of starvation destitution and want in its absence and the problem of indolence and deterioration when distributed among the unemployed unwisely.

WINNIPEG, Nov. 20—Briek price rallies in wheat on the Winnipeg grain exchange today followed similar recoveries at Chicago and late-session development of export demand.

Values closed at the highest levels of the lively session, 3-4 to 1-4 cent higher. November was at \$1.08 5-8, December \$1.06 1-8, May \$1.08 and July \$1.07.

Until the final minutes of trading, prices had fluctuated irregularly. A pre-closing burst of buying based on a late spurt at Chicago enabled the market to rally smartly.

The day's total export sales of Canadian wheat were placed at 500,000 bushels.

Cash and coarse grains moved up in sympathy with wheat.
