G. M. M. Canadian Commander by the captain and chief officer of the ship, following before the wreck commission's court here today. The grounding of the vessel occurred on July 3 in a bay near Plateau Point, Little Miquelon island.

STEAMER SUNK IN COLLISION NEAR SEATTLE

SEATTLE WASH. July 28.—The Osaka Shosha Kaisha steamship Hawaii Maru, outward bound, collided with the Puget Sound passenger steamer Calisto near West Point, just out of Seattle harbor, this morning.

Wireless messages from the master of the Hawaii Maru said: "All hands saved," but asked that tugs be sent immediately. Two tugs and the passenger steamer Hyacker departed immediately.

Later it was learned that the Calisto heavily laden sank within ten minutes after the accident. All the Calisto's passengers and crew were saved.

MEN AND WOMEN ENGAGE IN FIGHT

MONTREAL, July 28.—Five women and two men were placed under arrest early today during a fight near the E. A. Small Company's factory at 112 Beaver Hill. The trouble is said, was caused by an argument in connection with the settled strike of garment workers.

The majority of those arrested are charged with assault in a complaint lodged by Ida Tanghe 58 Mozart St.
