CANADA THE NATION.

A. J. Dawson in the London Standard discusses the question of Canada as a nation. He remarks that not long ago the word "colonial" was used in the Mother Country as applicable to all the King's subjects living beyond the seas, but Canada has for some reason been excepted from the list of Colonies, and Canadians are no longer spoken of as colonials. This, too, although the British people are slower to change their forms of expression than most others. "We do not now make the mistake of calling their magnificent country a colony," he says.

"For Canada and the Canadian," are already a nation and it may well be that their destiny is that of one of the greatest of nations. Seen in the light of history Canada of today very strongly suggests this. But the immediate point is that Canada and the Canadians are a nation now. This fact is borne in upon every intelligent person who visits the Dominion." Mr. Dawson, who recently visited Canada with the British newspaper men, was impressed with the following facts:

Canada has an unbroken wheat field 90 miles long by 30 miles wide, the largest in the world. Canada has the biggest and most prolific sea fisheries in the world. Canada has the largest grain mill in the British Empire and the biggest grain elevator in the world. The Dominion has one of the richest goldfields in the world, the largest nickel mines in the world, and the thickest coal seam in the world. A larger tonnage passes through the Suez canal in eight months than through Suez in a year. Canada's bank deposits have trebled in ten years, and doubled in the last four years. Canada's savings per head of population are larger than any other country in the world.

Such facts and many more of the same sort impressed our British visitors of a few months since. Most Canadians were aware of these things long ago and have passed the stage where there was any lingering doubt in their minds about Canada being a nation. Still it is well to be assured that the fact is coming into recognition in England. It is common enough that the growing youth becomes conscious of his manhood before his father takes note of it. John B. may be only beginning to notice it now, but John C. has been doing business in pretty extensive fashion for himself for some years past.

MR. BORDEN'S TOUR.

Leader Borden has shown himself and addressed public meetings through Canada from the Atlantic to the Pacific, excepting Prince Edward Island, within the past few months. There has been nothing very sensational developed during the tour, and it may be said that the platform he propounded at Halifax and which has no very greatly stirred the country. On the

other hand the gains to the Conservative party from its leader's missionary tour have been very considerable.

Mr. Borden is a pleasing personality. He has good abilities, he is amiable, honest, patriotic and clean. Thousands desired to see him and their wish has been gratified. Among the number it is safe to say many will be attracted, and few if any repelled. His tour has tended in a quiet way to increase the solidarity of the party, to strengthen its hope and confidence, and to improve its organization. It has done something also to remove any remaining question as to his fitness to lead. More than ever before the Conservative party in Canada is now convinced that if not in all respects an ideal leader, Robert L. Borden is the best man now in sight for that position.
