LARGER FAMILIES SEEN

TORONTO, Mar. 30—Larger families are likely to be found again among the upper classes following a period of stationary population. Hon. Wesley Frost, United States consul-general at Montreal, told the Women's Canadian Club here yesterday in an address on "Declining Birth-Rate."

Tracing by statistics the rise and fall of population, Mr. Frost cited several theories on the subject. Coming to the present period he said the birth rate showed a definite decline which was all the more significant since science had extended the normal expectancy of life.

Arguments in favor of a stationary population were given by Mr. Frost, chief of which was that the average age of the population became a little older. Faster infusion of new life, he said, citing the argument for the other side, might make for more zeal in innovation and invention and large families taught the co-operative spirit that caused people to live happily together.
