BUTTER TOO DEAR FOR MONTREAL

Syrup and Jam, Says the Grocers are Taking Its Place. Butter has been Brought Back from England.

MONTREAL, Feb. 28.—So prohibitive has been the price of butter in Montreal during the past few months that this highly popular article of food has of necessity been banished from the tables of the poor of the city.

Butter is now 38 cents a pound and it will soon be 45 cents a pound.

These figures are too steep for families whose income are about the average, and butter has been most conspicuous by reason of its absence from the tables of many families. Grocers throughout the city state

that sales have fallen off remarkably this winter. However, in place of selling butter they have been selling unusually large quantities of molasses, syrup and jam, these evidently being utilized to replace butter.

Canadian butter that was shipped to Great Britain last fall has been brought back here, because it was cheaper than what is now being made in this country.

WILL GO TO FORTY-FIVE CENTS.

Those who eat good butter will be paying 45 cents per pound for it before the end of March. This is the opinion generally expressed by wholesale and retail produce merchants in the city.

At present the best creamy butter is selling wholesale at 33 cents, and retailing at 38 cents per pound. It is certain that next Monday the wholesale price will be 35 cents and the retail price 40 cents.

As has been said, good butter this year is very scarce, and local retailers find it exceedingly difficult to come near to supplying the demand. Some alarmists have taken the trouble to argue, moreover, that the farmers are getting rid of their milk cattle, and that next summer butter will be scarcer than ever. This is not the case.

FARMERS SELL POOR STOCK.

The farmers are selling off their poor stock, and are retaining their best daily cattle, as they have been assured that with the enormous immigration into Canada from Europe of dairy produce, especially butter, next season will be a record-breaking one in the domestic consumption. The upward tendency in butter prices will cease about the end of March, and the farmers will then prove to the pessimists that they can produce large quantities and can reduce the prices very considerably.

BRINGS DEAD TO LIFE AGAIN

Resuscitates Animals Apparently Dead By Means Of Electrical Impulses

PARIS, Feb. 29.—Dr. Louise B. Robinovitch of New York presented a remarkable paper this week before the French Biological Society on a new method of resuscitating animals apparently dead from electrical shock.

Miss Robinovitch, whose methods of electrical anaesthesia have already attained wide attention in France, differ from that of Dr. Ludwig and other French experts in that she places the cathode, or negative pole, near the spinal column, and the anode over the kidneys, and gives the patient a series of rhythmic electrical impulses. When treated thus resuscitation is said to be very rapid.

A friend of Dr. Robinovitch said today that she would shortly make application to competent authorities in New York for permission to apply her system of resuscitation to the next murderer put to death by electricity.
