...THE CARDIGAN EGG CIRCLE—The Cardigan Egg Circle, No. 79, King's County, of which Mr. Austin McGilvary, Glenfanning, was manager, began operations for the season of 1915 on May the first and concluded on the 31st October last.

The territory covered by the circle included the settlements of Launching, De Gros Marsh, St. George's, Seal River, Mitchell River, Glenfanning, Corraville and Iona. The number of patrons who supplied eggs to the circle in each district was as follows: Glenfanning, thirteen; Corraville and Iona, twenty-three; Seal River, seven; Mitchell River, thirteen; De Gros Marsh, seven; Launching, seventeen; St. George's, eleven. Number of cases shipped was eight hundred of cases shipped was eight hundred (800), which at thirty dozens to a case, gives a total of twenty-four thousand dozens or two hundred and eighty-eight thousand eggs at an estimated value of five thousand four hundred and thirty dollars (\$5,430). Mr. Patrick P. Morrison, of Launching, supplied the largest number of eggs, one thousand dozens in all. In this connection it is worthy of note that the Mount Hope correspondent of the Guardian recently mentioned the fact that Mr. George Arthur, of that place, sold eight hundred dozens of eggs to the Dundas Egg Circle and enquired who could beat this record. The figures above quoted show that Mr. Morrison beat the Mount Hope man "all hollow." The other principal patrons of the Cardigan Egg Circle were Mrs. Edward Macdonald, St. George's; Henry Green, Mitchell River; Angus McLellan, St. George's; Patrick O. Rice, Glenfanning; Mrs. Andrew Redmond, P. D. Sharkey, Mrs. James McMillan and Archie McDefmott, Corraville; Miss Katie Iteville, Glenfanning; Daniel McCormack, Aeneas P. Macdonald and Ronald J. McCormack, Launching. That the Egg Circle is a good thing for the farmers and should be patronized by them is shown by the fact that upwards of five thousand dollars was distributed among the ninety-odd patrons of the Cardigan Circle during the six months in which it was in operation. Among other advantages of this new method of marketing eggs a few noteworthy ones might be here enumerated, namely that the farmers are saved from the necessity of travelling to and from the market in order to dispose of their eggs, and are enabled to devote the time thus saved to other lines of farm work; they (the farmers) are paid the highest cash price for their eggs without leaving home as the collector goes to each house for the eggs and they are thus enabled to pay cash for their groceries and other commodities, by which a considerable saving is effected, and the co-operative system of marketing creates a healthy spirit of rivalry which cannot fail to have a most beneficial effect on the industry, while it is a well-known fact that since the advent of the Egg Circle the local dealers pay a much higher price for eggs than formerly. Mr. McGilvary, the local manager of the Cardigan Egg Circle takes this opportunity of thanking the patrons for their generous support and for many courtesies rendered.—&

McLeod, of Martinvale, whose horse was seriously injured by colliding with another rig while crossing Cardigan Bridge as described in a recent issue of the Guardian, but which it was thought at first would recover from the injury has since been compelled to destroy the animal. In spite of all that could be done by the veterinary in attendance tetanus (lockjaw) set in and the owner was of necessity compelled to put an end to the animal's sufferings. Much sympathy is felt for Mr. McLeod in his loss.—&

The dredge began operations about the fifteenth of December last. The work is somewhat difficult owing to the great depth of water required by the new boat and latterly owing to the formation of lily which somewhat re-

tards the work. On Saturday the work was carried on with the thermometer at two degrees below zero, some of the men being slightly frost-bitten. The dredge will remain in Georgetown harbor for the winter.—&
