600,135 ACRES ADDED TO FOREST.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 23. — President Roosevelt signed a proclamation today, added 600,135 acres to the Humboldt national forest in the northern part of Elko county, Nevada, bordering on the Idaho line. This area contains a large amount of pine, fir and aspen timber, estimated at 64,000,000 linear feet. This addition gives the forest a total area of 1,158,818 acres.
