—The latest news, first of all.

—Sheriff Wright held court in Summerside yesterday and counted the votes cast for Read and Delaney in the fourth district. The majority for Delaney was found to be two. Capt. Read made application to have one vote for Delaney struck off as being pulled in the wrong poll. The returning officer thereupon adjourned his court till Wednesday morning the 25th in order to investigate the objection. Mr Delaney will then be declared elected with either one or two votes. It is highly probable that Capt. Read will not let the case rest just there.

—During the time that has passed since the great Summerside fire, much has been said about town improvements by the different councillors holding office, but nothing has been done about straightening and widening the streets in the burned districts. Railway street running north from quite near the railway station to Hanover street, a distance of over three hundred feet, has become a very important street, so many people turn off Water street here to avoid the Railway crossing. The fire destroyed all the building on the west side of this street which is only twelve feet wide. Owners were willing to give the land to the town at a low price, yet nothing has been done. Now one building is in course of erection, which stands out within three feet of the street boundary. There is a water main with hydrant along this street which will never turn in much revenue to the town. Just think of a street twelve feet wide, in one of the most public parts of the town, with a sidewalk four feet wide, and not enough room left for two carriages to pass each other.

—A correspondent writing from O'Leary says:—The grain and root crop is doing well since the recent rain, and a bumper crop is expected. Haying is almost completed and the reports are that the hay is of a better quality than fully as large a crop as the preceding years. H. W. Turner is making rapid progress towards the completion of his new house and when finished will add greatly to the beauty of the village.—Millage Ledstone is home on a visit to his mother from Seattle. He has been absent for nine years and has travelled a lot. He finds great improvements in his native place and hopes to settle here before many years. He returns on the 25th inst. While here he has made many new friends and will take home many pleasant memories. His cousin Florence Pate accompanies him to town where he will visit his grandmother. Wm. McNaught and wife are visiting at Alex Carruther's, Hawley. They are on a two month's vacation and will leave for their home in California on first October.

The remains were accompanied by his son George. Mr. Knight was 82 years of age and had resided in the United States only two years.

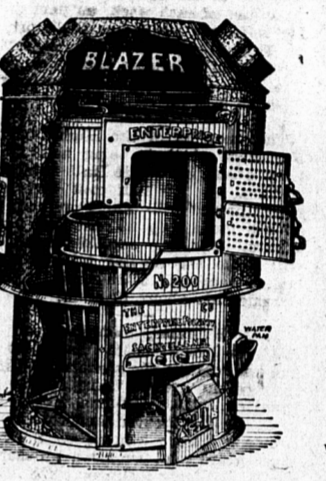


