THE FIRE IN SYDNEY.

Very great interest and concern was felt in this city on Saturday evening when it became known that a disastrous fire had occurred in Sydney. There was in this case, besides the warm interest felt in a sister city as such, the fact that a number of Island people were among the principal sufferers. Our inadequate telegraph service and the intervention of Sunday accounts for the full details of the disaster not being sooner made known.

As will be seen from the particulars elsewhere given in this issue, the fire has been a most serious one, seventy-eight buildings being destroyed, which with their contents were valued at over half a million dollars. This great loss is not more than half covered by the insurance. Although the loss from the burning of a mercantile district of a town is necessarily greater than in a residential district, it has this small compensation that a comparatively small number have been deprived of home and shelter.

We greatly regret the disaster which has befallen Sydney, but we doubt not that the enterprise and energy which so quickly built up the town will very speedily restore it. Sydney has a great future before it and the check its growth has now received, severe though it is, will be bravely faced and no doubt quickly surmounted. But individual losers, who had little or no insurance must feel their heavy losses for many years to come.

The soft coal production of the United States fifty years ago was about 10,000,000 tons yearly. In 1870 it was 17,000,000 tons, and in 1900 it had reached 203,000,000 tons, an increase of twenty fold in fifty years.

A railway tunnel is now under construction, some five miles in length to connect the Isle of Wight with the English Mainland. As the population of the Isle of Wight is only about three fourths that of Prince Edward Island the remaining advocates of the tunnel scheme here may find some encouragement in the facts here recited.

Among the numerous letters in support of Mr. Hazard's candidature in West Queens which THE GUARDIAN has received and been unable to find space for are several from Islanders abroad. One very well written letter comes from Bristol, Virginia. It will be seen from this that the interest in the coming election is by no means confined to residents of the Province.

The Presbyterian Witness of Halifax speaks of a "very remarkable article" in THE GUARDIAN on Sabbath-breaking in Prince Edward Island. The Witness makes liberal extracts and warmly commends THE GUARDIAN's attitude on this question. We feel assured that the great majority of Presbyterian pastors and churches feel in the same way, and our thanks and the thanks of the community are due to the pastors who in their pulpits or with their pens have spoken out on the question. It is only in Charlottetown that a Presbyterian pastor has felt that he could afford to treat the question with silence in his pulpit and with a sneer from the public platform.

The postoffice has been making experiments between London and Glasgow with a new system of telegraphy by which 12 messages can be sent over the same wire simultaneously, and the number can be doubled by the duplex method of transmission.
