THE MARKETS

MONTREAL, March 28.—Cattle trading was active with some fancy prices on choice fat cows and fat heavy bulls for the kosher trade. A couple of lots of goods steers of medium heavy weight were sold for \$8.40 and \$8.50. Fairly good steers of lighter weights brought \$7.75 and prices ranged from this figure down to \$6.75. Good cows were around \$6.50 and medium kinds from \$5.25 to \$5.75. A few choice extra fat cows were picked out for kosher at \$7.00 to \$7.75 and a few choice heavy bulls sold up to \$6.00 and common bulls down to \$4.50.

Quotations—Butcher steers good \$7.75 to \$8.75, medium, \$7.00 to \$7.50, common, \$6.50 to \$7.00. Butcher heifers good \$7.00 to \$7.75, medium \$6.25 to \$6.75, common \$5.50 to \$6.00. Butcher cows good \$6.00 to \$6.75, medium \$4.00 to \$5.75 to \$6.00, common \$4.50 to \$5.00.

Calf Receipts 1,041. The calves were of poor quality and the bulk sold from 7.75 to \$8.25. A few better lots brought \$9.00 and the poorest \$7.00 or less in a couple of cases.

Quotations: Good veal \$9.00, medium \$7.75 to \$8.25, common \$7.00. Sheep receipts 72 Yearling lambs were sold from \$10.25 to \$11.00 and sheep 450 to \$6.50. A few baby lambs were on sale and quotations on these ranged from \$9.00 to \$12.00 each.

Quotations—Ewes \$4.50 to \$6.50; lambs, good, \$11.00, common 10.25. Hog receipts, 2,992, \$11.50 was the ruling price for hogs today with sales either on a flat or graded basis. When graded a premium of \$2.00 per hog was paid selects and a cut of 50 cents per hundredweight taken on the shops and heavies. A couple of lots of poor quality hogs were sold for \$11.25 and on one market where there were less than 500 hogs for sale, butchers paid up to \$12.00. Sows sold from \$9.00 to \$9.50.

BERLIN, March 28.—Through-out Germany the memory of Ludwig van Beethoven was honored yesterday on the centenary of the great composer's death. Country-wide celebrations were held in schools, conservatories, universities, singing societies, theatres and operas.

In most of the schools the memorial exercises were followed by a half holiday.

Newspapers devoted much space to articles about Beethoven, one of the most striking features being publication of tributes from leading musicians of the world.

6 Teams Ready in N. H. L. Play-offs

MONTREAL, Mar. 28.—The long preliminary campaign of 220 games in the two sections of the National Hockey League has ended and six of the ten teams to survive for the winter's grind—the first three in each section—are ready for the start of the play downs for the sectional titles and league championship, which will commence Tuesday with the third teams meeting the second teams of their respective groups in the semi-finals, a two game series total goals to count, the winner to earn the right to meet the first place team of their division for the group honors.

Referees Lou Marsh and Bobby Hewitson, of Toronto, will be in command of play when the Canadiens receive the champion Montreal Maroons before a packed crowd at the Forum here. Canadiens will enter the two-game series strong favorites over the present titleholders, and are conceded the better chance of meeting Ottawa in the sectional finals.

Referees Billy Bell and Ritchie of Montreal, will handle the two games between Chicago Black Hawks and the Boston Bruins, the first to be played at Madison Square Garden Tuesday as Chicago's home game, the Hawks being unable to utilize their home rink at the mid-western city, the second tussle for semi-final honors in the United States group and the right to meet the New York Rangers in the sectional finals.

Bobby Jones Wins Southern Title

ATLANTA, Ga., Mar. 28.—Bobby Jones, open golf champion of Great Britain and the United States, won another title Saturday when he captured the Southern open at East Lake Country Club, his home course. He played the 72 holes in 281, eight strokes ahead of Johnny Farrell, New York, and John Golden, Westover, N. J., who tied for second place and the \$4,000 money award for the leading professional. They had scores of 289 and will play off an 18-hole match for first money Monday afternoon, the loser to take second money of \$1,750.
