HOUSE OF LORDS IN SHABBY STATE

The Council Chamber of Peers, England Is Sadly In Need of Cleaning

LONDON, March 23.—The House of Peers is in need sadly in need of repair. Not only are the red leather benches in a dingy condition, but the seats in the Strangers' Gallery, in which the peers may invite their admiring friends, are too uncomfortable to deserve the name of seats at all.

"I am generally sorry for the peers," said a Liberal M. P. yesterday, "but still sorer for their friends, because the benches in the Strangers' Gallery are as hard and uncomfortable as can be.

"To tell the honest truth, they are merely planks of wood covered with a stripe of red carpet as an apologetic attempt at upholstery. Now, we are very much better off in the Commons.

"The benches we can offer our men friends there are decently upholstered—in fact, they merit the description 'magnificent' in comparison with the 'strangers' benches in the upper house.

"Members of the Commons can take their friends to the bar of the House of Lords on obtaining tickets from Black Rod, and I should say that a 'standing seat' there is infinitely preferable to the accommodation up above, which their lordships can obtain for their friends.

A gentleman who has had recent experience of these seats says that there were no backs to them, and that altogether they were "worse than the benches in the gallery of a third-rate provincial music hall."

The result was as follows:—Nellie Dot (Prowse) took first money, three straight heats; Fernando, Capt. Jackson captured second place in straight heats; Tina (Kearney) third place. It is but fair to say that all the horses acted and trotted well.

High Secretary L. U. Fowler of I. O. Foresters Talks About the Proposed Increase of Rates—Says Toronto Despatch is False and Foolish

High Secretary L. U. Fowler of the Independent Order of Foresters who was in the City yesterday was asked about a Toronto despatch in reference to increased rates on the order members of the order which appeared in The Guardian of yesterday. He said that the despatch was as foolish as it was false, for how any one in Toronto could expect 215 delegates in the Supreme Court meeting in June next? He went on: "It is on a par with a despatch from Toronto some time ago in which it was said that Elliott Stephenson had resigned and Harry Collins had taken his place." The High Secretary said, that legislation was being passed at Ottawa that would affect four fraternal societies of which the I. O. F. is the greatest. If at our Supreme Court meeting it is learned that some of the delegates will no doubt find a remedy, but as one who will have a vote in that Supreme Court meeting I do not propose to help destroy such a useful and benevolent society as the Independent Order of Foresters to please any Government or actuary.

GERMANS AND HOTTENTOTS

Teuton Troops Met with Much Hardship in Forced Marches.

BERLIN, March 23.—The government publishes a cablegram from South Africa reporting a battle between the German expedition and a force of Hottentots in the desert. The German troops had been sent out to find Simon Joppers, the last of the Hottentot chiefs, who is still hostile. The engagement was a very severe one. The enemy lost fifty-eight killed. Several men and several women were captured but Joppers escaped. The German losses also were heavy. Capt. von Erckert, commander of the expeditionary force, Lieut. Binzer and two privates being killed, and seventeen wounded, of whom nine were seriously wounded.

The German force left Cochoas on March 6th, 430 strong, with four machine guns and seven hundred camels. They made forced marches into the waterless desert for four days before stopping long enough to cook a fresh supply of food. The only water found was a dirty pool which was not sufficient to quench the thirst of the camels.

Capt. von Erckert finally found the Hottentots encamped on March 11th. He began to attack on the next morning and soon there was fierce fighting all along the line. The German commander fell in the first onslaught and the second officer took charge of the expeditionary forces which drove the blacks in all directions.

Chief Joppers' power has been badly weakened by this defeat but it will be necessary for the Germans to continue a vigilant watch over the approaches to the desert.
