For points east (with connections) to Souris and Georgetown on line of railway, 3.00 p.m.

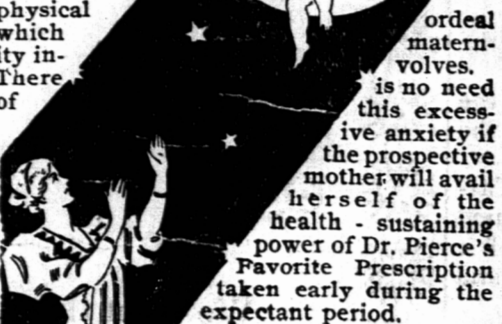
For Courier route to Southport and all points thence to Belfast, 6.15 a.m.
