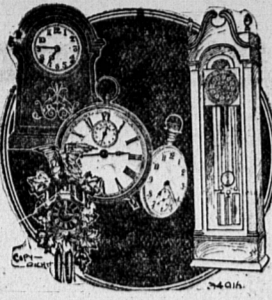

On Tuesday evening the boiler room in the slaughter house of E. Wheatley, St. Peter's Road, caught fire and was considerably damaged. The fire was prevented from spreading to the main slaughter house.

The recent nomination of John H. Purcain, Rustico, as Liberal Conservative candidate to contest the coming bye-election in the second District of Queen's was moved by Douglas Currie, Fairview, and seconded by John Newson, City.

A recent despatch from Lunenburg made the following reference to two well known parties here: George Nedeff, the Syrian wonder, and Sandy McLeod, the Scotch middleweight champion, wrestled at King's gymnasium last night before an audience of 200 people. McLeod undertook to throw Nedeff three times in an hour, but only secured the fall after 30 minutes. Nedeff, who is about forty pounds lighter than McLeod, was on the defensive most of the time. McLeod put Nedeff on his back with a toe hold and hammerlock. After the match McLeod said he never gave as great a handicap before.

Next Wednesday night he said he would wrestle Nedeff for best two out of three, with no time limit. Nedeff asked for a week to train, but McLeod said he could not wait longer than Wednesday. It is likely, however, that the match will be held here on the date mentioned by McLeod.

Amongst the Montserratians who expressed their views on the reciprocity proposals, Dr. Andrew McPhail a native of Belfast, P. E. Island, said that these proposals were so important that no man could foretell the results. One fact stood out clearly—that the proposals were not of the nature of a treaty of reciprocity, and so were free of objections inherent in that form of agreement. The people of the United States appeared to want certain Canadian products, and they were free to decide what duties they shall pay to themselves. The people of Canada appeared to want certain products from the United States, and they were about to decide what duties they will pay to themselves. No identification of interests had been made with an alien country. The only fear he had was that interested persons would raise the cry that freer commercial intercourse with the United States would lead to a lessened loyalty to British ideals and institutions. That allegation could be left to disprove itself. He felt that the people at large would accept these proposals with enthusiasm, especially in the Maritime Provinces, where for 30 years they had borne the full force of the protective system, and profited the least by it. If these proposals were put in force he believed a new era would be opened for these provinces, especially for Prince Edward Island, which he expected would double its population in generation. The only objection he had was that this was a farmer's tariff. This, he thought, its chief merit, especially in a community of which farmers form 65 per cent of the people. He thought it quite possible that hardship might result to certain persons, but these should comfort themselves by reflecting upon the benefits which they have enjoyed for the past thirty years.—Ex.

NEW YORK, Feb. 2—A cargo of dynamite, in transit from a freight car to a lighter moored at Communipaw, N. J., exploded 150 yards south of Jersey City Terminal, and in the widespread ruin that followed, seven men are known to have been killed.

Seven more are missing and hundreds were wounded. Thirty seems to be a conservative estimate of dead, and the property damage will hardly fall below \$750,000.
