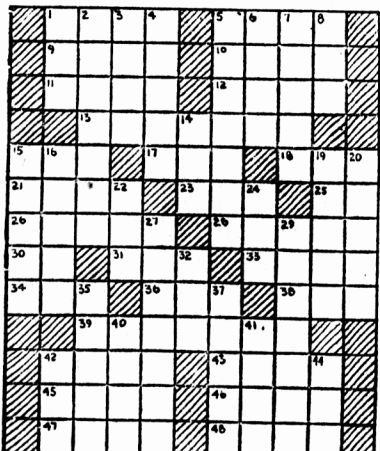

Contract Bridge

Bidding Problem A difficult, but not insoluble, bidding problem was involved in today's deal.

Hand diagram for a contract bridge deal. South is dealer. North-South vulnerable. East-West 60 on score. Cards: South: A 9 5 4, K J 8, K 10 9 8 7 6, K Q J. North: 10 7 3, 7 5 4 2, 10 7 4, 7 5 2. Deal: ♠ A 9 5 4, ♥ K J 8, ♦ K 10 9 8 7 6, ♣ 10 7 3.

The bidding: South West North East 1 ♠ 1 NT 2 ♠ Pass 2 NT Pass Pass Pass

West opened the club king, and South had little trouble in making ten tricks. No other opening lead would have changed this result. The discussion immediately arose as to whether North could logically have gone to three notrump or whether South could have bid even more strongly than he did. Scrutiny of each hand, individually reveals that South, for all his wealth in honor-tricks, could not have risked a more aggressive bid than two notrump, since he lacked even one sure stopper in spades, and moreover, since he could not count on North for a great deal.

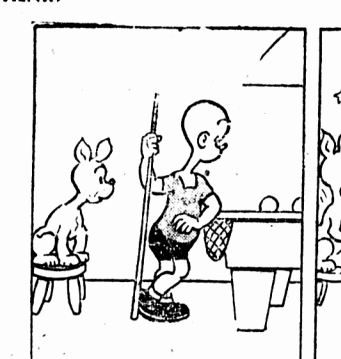

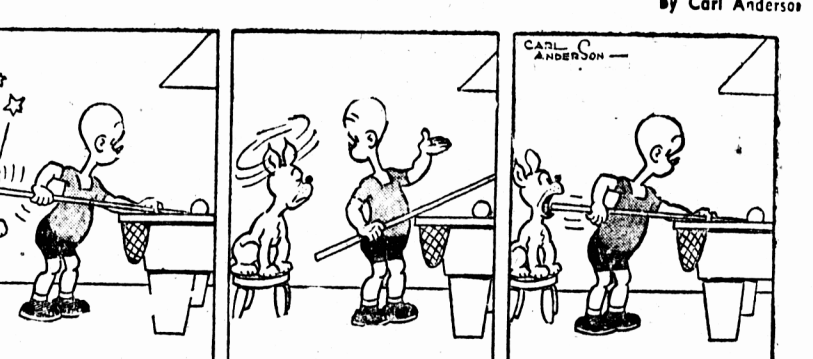
