

IMO'S HELMSMAN ARRESTED AS SPY

Patient in Massachusetts Hospital Aroused Suspicion of Nurse Whom He Offered \$50 for His Release. Nurse Notified Authorities

HALIFAX, N. S., Dec. 17.—Charles Jacobsen, helmsman on the Norwegian steamer Ima, the Belgian relief ship, whose collision with the munition steamer Mont Blanc led to the disaster of last Thursday, was detained as a German spy suspect today. He was turned over to the military authorities by officials of the Massachusetts relief hospital, where he has been under treatment.

DOMINION TRUST ASSETS DWINDLE IN LEGISLATION

VANCOUVER, Dec. 15.—During an application to the supreme court in Vancouver for the fixing of a definite stipend for the liquidator of the Dominion Trust Co. for the remainder of the liquidation many interesting statements were made including one in which it was said that the estate had been involved in 102 law suits, that the capital of the company had been dissolved and that the assets had dwindled to a comparatively small figure.

THE ALLIED FORCES HOLDING THEIR OWN

Germans Deliver Powerful Attacks with Reinforced Armies but are Everywhere Repulsed with Heavy Losses.

LONDON, Dec. 15.—The British, French and Italian lines are still holding firmly against onslaughts of the Teutonic allies, delivered with heavy reinforcements that have been drawn from the Russian front since the cessation of hostilities there under the armistice.
