While we witness with pardonable pride your safe return to your native land, we thank God, who has been your guiding chart, for so choice a blessing.

Realizing that we lack adequate words to fully convey to you our heartfelt appreciation, we ask you to accept this small gift, which is but a feeble expression of the recognition which we owe you.

PARIS, April 28.—Sir Robert Borden has presided at several meetings of British delegations during the latter part of the week, and on Friday he attended a meeting of the Council of Three and assisted in the examination of the subjects under discussion. On Saturday he and Mr. Sifton also attended a meeting of the same circle at which the report of the Commission of International regime of ports, waterways and railways, was examined before its final inclusion in the terms of the peace treaty.

Canadian ministers also have been engaged in conferences with other delegations respecting the minor difficulties which inevitably arise in modifying the representations of commissions.

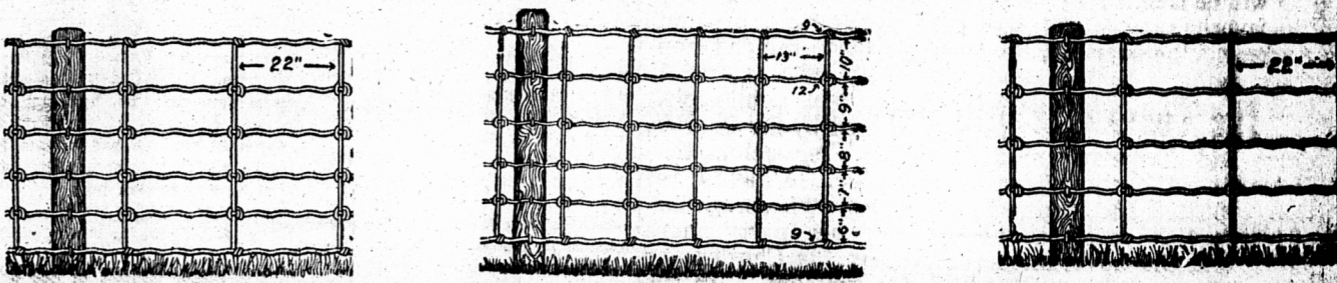
