*OF INTEREST TO FISHERMEN.—It may be of interest to fishermen to know that steam trawlers are not allowed to fish within 12 miles of the nearest shore on Atlantic seaboard of Canada as per order in council dated Ottawa, April 6th, 1915.

And not only so but the master of every steam trawler, at any port on the Atlantic seaboard of Canada, shall before departing come before the Collector of Customs or other proper officer and deliver to him a report on wards under his hand of the destination of such vessel, stating her name, country and tonnage, the port of Registry, the name of the master, the country, of the owners, the number of the crew and such other particulars as are demanded by such officers. The report outwards shall also contain a declaration to the effect—that the Master of the steam trawler in consideration of the clearance granted by the officers of certain undertakes and agrees to restrict all fishing operations by such steam trawlers to waters which are at least 12 miles distant from the nearest shore of the Atlantic seaboard of Canada during the calendar year in which the clearance is granted. The non-compliance of the form of any regulations will make the ship liable to seizure by the Customs regulations. The above regulations were amended 28th December 1916 limiting the time of restrictions to be from the first day of May, to the 31st day of December. Also that during the month of January the restrictions were binding in Chedabouche and St. Peter's Bay within lane drawn from Cranberry Island Light to Green Island light.—S.

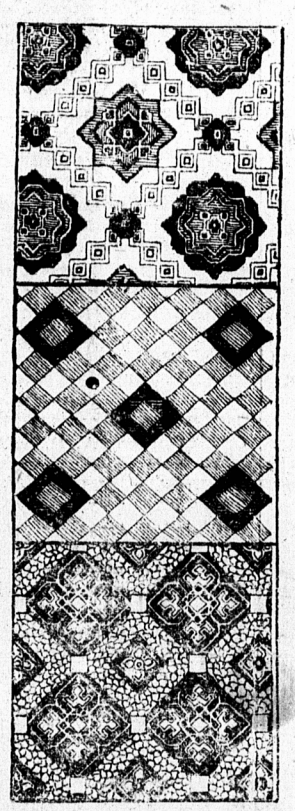

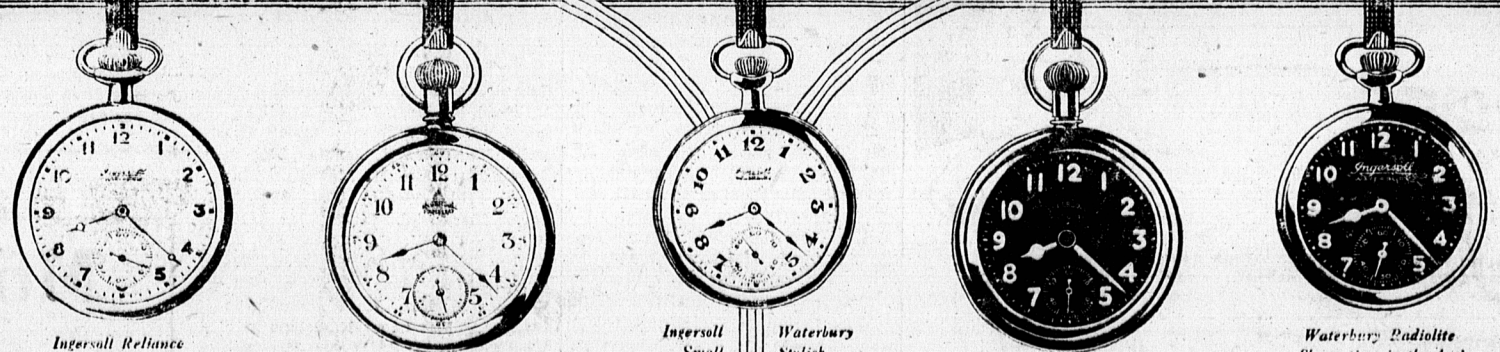
