Furness, the great Shakespearean; Booth Tarkington, and Helen Keller—the last a sketch by Edward Everett Hale. A beautifully illustrated article on the "Washington Irving Country" by Mr. Hamilton W. Mabie; a car full survey of "Novels of a season," with portraits of authors; a "talk about" "Children's Book Plates," by Zella A. Dixon, with charming and amusing examples; and group-views of important recent books are among the features having special reference to books and authors. Ex-Secretary John D. Long, under the title "Building the New Navy," contributes the second of the important and authoritative series of twelve papers he is publishing in The Outlook on the general subject, "The New American Navy." Mr. R. Uterdash, the best of our marine artists, is furnishing original pictures for the series, which are also otherwise illustrated fully. A five-page poem by Bliss Carman, "Father Hudson," has dramatic and poeticality.
