HEAVY PASSENGER SERVICE (Special to The Guardian) HALIFAX, N. S., May 26—Although the winter port season ended weeks ago transatlantic passenger traffic through the port of Halifax continues brisk, a total of 615 passengers disembarking here on Saturday and Sunday from four liners in port from Europe. The ships were the Frederik VIII from Copenhagen, Labourdonnais, from Bordeaux and Vigo, Gripsholm, from Gothenburg and Stavanger, from Oslo and Bergen. Among the passengers landing from the Frederik VIII were three boys, the oldest aged nine years and the youngest four who are travelling alone from Denmark all the way to Winnipeg. On arrival at Halifax, they were looked after by Canadian National Railway officials who will hand them over to relatives in Winnipeg. Two special Canadian National trains left Halifax yesterday with the passengers from their ships for Montreal and western Canada.
