## FEDERAL INVESTIGATION

(Canadian Press)  
WASHINGTON, Jan. 27.—A sweeping investigation into conditions in the coal fields of Colorado, and the Copper Fields of Michigan was authorized today by the House.

The hearings will be continued in the sub-committee.

The resolution carries authority to subpoena witnesses for testimony under oath and to produce production record papers.

Seven subjects of inquiry and specified in the resolution running from importation of arms for strikers to whether postal laws and interfered with. The debate on the resolution was brief. All agreed they will come to the Federal investigation.

WIRELESS.—Operator B. Keefe of this Province has been appointed night operator at West Bay Road, C. B. and left Truro, where he has been working for his new position.

THE STEAMERS.—Wednesday morning, the soft weather enabled the boats to make a better time in crossing and no difficulty was experienced. The Earl Grey docked in Georgetown from Pictou with 451 tons of mail, and sixteen passengers. The Minto docked in Pictou from Georgetown at 10.20 with twenty-two passengers, forty-five sacks of mail and forty-two tons freight. The mail special arrived in Charlottetown this afternoon at 12.07.

WIRELESS STATION.—A map of the wireless telegraph coast of the Dominion of Canada, with the report of the department of the naval service, shows that there are forty-one stations situated in the Dominion. In British Columbia there are ten stations, in Manitoba two, in Ontario eight, in Quebec ten, in Anticosti one, in New Brunswick one, in Nova Scotia eight and in the Island of Newfoundland one. The normal range of which in nautical miles is 150 and the wave length 600 metres.

THE HUDSON BAY TRIP.—The Department of the Naval Service has issued with its last report of the trip the H. S. S. Minto, commanded by Capt. F. Anderson, made to Hudson Bay under the orders of Hon. J. D. Hazen, Minister of the Naval Service of Canada. One of the maps shows the path followed by the steamer and the ice encountered on her way to Port Nelson, while the other shows the Nelson shoals and the path followed on her homeward course.

A RUNAWAY.—Last night about 8 o'clock a young gentleman in company with two young ladies was enjoying a drive when his horse took fright and overturned the sleigh throwing the occupants to the ground with great force. When the accident occurred the driver was endeavoring to turn his horse around on the corner of Prince and Grafton Streets when one of the runners of the sleigh slid into a deep drain and overturned the conveyance. The horse started to run up Prince Street but was captured before he got very far. The party resumed their drive on the horse and sleigh being returned and are probably none the worse of their thrilling experience.
