N. Y. Stocks In Sharp Setback

(By Victor Kubank)

NEW YORK, May 6—(AP)—Stocks generally stumbled over profit cashing in today's market although a little late buying and short covering reduced most extreme losses running to 3 or more points for leaders.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite was off 5 of a point at 62.6, sharpest setback since April and its first recession since April 28.

McIntyre, with a loss of 1-2, was the heaviest loser among Canadian issues. Distillers, off 1-8 in morning trade, was the exception to the loss trend with a closing gain of 1-8. Canadian Pacific and Dome Mines each gave up 1-4. On the curb, Giant Yellowknife eased 1-8. Standard Oil of Ohio was up 1-4 at 26 1-2 on a raised quarterly. Youngstown Sheet added 1-8 at 62 1-2 on a big jump in net. A hoisted dividend lifted Consolidated Edison, Santa Fe, International Harvester, United Aircraft and Johns-Manville.

Do Pont was off 2 at 180 1-2, Eastman Kodak 2 at 238 and Great Northern Railway 1 3-4 at 39 1-4. Down around a point or so were U. S. Steel at 69 5-8, Bethlehem 84 1-2, General Motors 88 3-8, Chrysler 102 1-2, U. S. Rubber 46 1-2, Montgomery Ward 53 1-2, United Air Lines 25 7-8, International Nickel 31 1-2, Air Reduction 31 1-2, American Can 91 1-2, Union Carbide 88 1-2 and Boeing 17.

American Telephone stiffened as progress in moves to end the strike was reported but the stock emerged off 1-8 at 165 3-4.

Profit-taking Sends Toronto Stocks Down

TORONTO, May 6—(CP)—Yesterday's profit-taking move continued shortly after opening on the Toronto stock exchange today to send prices for all groups downwards for moderate losses.

Base metals recovered somewhat near close but were still down for the day. Western Oils traded more actively in the afternoon session for fractional losses.

The exchange's closing index listed goods down 39 to 102.08, silver 1.10 to 24.05. Volume for the day was 62,000 shares, down about 220,000 from yesterday.

Senior goods traded on gains in majority but speculatives were down for more than two losses for each gain. Anor advanced 5 cents to \$4.30, Lake Shore 1-4 to 14 1-8, La Luz 5 to \$3.40, Lamaque 10 to \$6.50, Wright-Hargreaves 3 to \$2.96, Bralorne, Dome and McIntyre were off fractions. Secondary issues closed on good gains for Alkalcho, Madsen, McMarmac, San Antonio, and losses for Cochennour, Conwest, Donalds, Duquesne, Giant, Hasaga, Heva, Lingman, Negus, Quebec Gold, Yukon.

East Sullivan in the base metal converted an early loss to a 10-cent gain at \$3.20, Falconbridge advanced 5 at \$4.50, Golden Manilow 5 at \$2.40, Pend Oreille 15 at \$2.65, Silver Miller 2 at 30, Nor-metal 2 at \$1.62, Down were Denison, Eureka, Hudson Bay 1-4 at 41 3-4, Nickel 1 at 35, Labrador 3 at \$3.65, MacDonald 5 at \$2.75, Osisko 6 at \$1.50, Quement 3-8 at 15, Sherritt 10 at \$3.25 and Steep Rock 3 at \$2.07.

ATTENTION POTATO PRODUCERS

The attention of potato producers is directed to the following Act passed at the recent session of the Provincial Legislature. Producers are urged to arrange immediately for necessary seed supplies that will conform to the provisions as outlined in this Act.

BE IT ENACTED by the Lieutenant-Governor and Legislative Assembly of the Province of Prince Edward Island as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as the "Prince Edward Island Potato Act."

2. From and after the passing of this Act, no person shall plant potatoes in the Province of Prince Edward Island unless the seed is of the class Foundation, Foundation "A", or Certified, as determined by the official inspections carried out by the Plant Protection Division, Science Service, Dominion Department of Agriculture. Provided, however, that this section shall not apply to potato crops which, in the aggregate, on an individual property, do not exceed one acre, unless by proclamation of the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council otherwise.

3. All potato crops as covered by Section 2 hereof shall be subject to inspection as follows:

(a) Subject to conformity with the regulations governing the production of certified seed potatoes, crops planted with Foundation or Foundation "A" seed with a view to seed certification, may be inspected by the Plant Protection Division, Dominion Department of Agriculture.

(b) Potato Crops including those planted with seed of the "Certified" class with a view to table stock production shall be inspected for bacterial ring rot, or any other disease or insect pest as may be determined from time to time, by duly authorized inspectors of the Prince Edward Island Department of Agriculture.

4. Each potato grower, as covered by Section 2 hereof, shall be required to register each field of potatoes for inspection as follows:

(a) If for seed potato production, applications shall be submitted to the District Seed Potato Inspector, Dominion Department of Agriculture, Charlottetown.

(b) If for table stock, production, application shall be submitted to the Prince Edward Island Department of Agriculture.

5. In accordance with the Certified Seed Potato Regulations each grower who applies for inspection of his crop for seed purposes shall be required, among other qualifications, to supply proof of the planting of seed of the Foundation or Foundation "A" class in the field for which inspection is requested. All other growers shall be required to supply proof of the purchase or certified seed used for planting the potato crop.

6. Each grower shall exercise the necessary care in the planting, cultivation, spraying, dusting or harvesting of his potato crop to avoid any possible contamination with bacterial ring rot through machinery, harvesting containers, storage or second hand bags.

7. Failure to comply with any of these regulations shall result upon summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$100 or in default of payment to imprisonment for a term not exceeding thirty days or both.

Montreal Stock Prices Unchanged

MONTREAL, May 6—(CP)—There was no definite indication of trend on the stock exchange and curb market today and at the close pluses and minuses were about evenly distributed in mainly quiet trading. Changes were mostly fractional. Selected issues accounted for bulk of volume.

Among leaders, Imperial Oil added 3-8 at 13 3-4. Feet 1-4 at 2 7-8 and B. C. Forest 1-8 at 3 5-8. Unchanged were C. W. Lumber, Cement Pfd., and Tobacco. International Paper was off 1-2. Canadian Breweries 1-4 and Famous Players and Consolidated Paper 1-8.

St. Lawrence Paper Pfd., advanced two points at 131 1-2, a new high. Dryden and McCoil were up 1-2. Smelters 3-8 and Asbestos and Shawinigan 1-8 each. Southmount added a cent. Brazilian and Hudson Bay erased earlier losses.

Nickel eased 5-8 and Canadian Locomotive 1-2 while National Breweries, Dosco "B" and Canadian Industries were down minor fractions. Bell slipped two points. Mines were dull and lightly traded.
