The former class was handled in his masterly style by Mr. Elliott, and the latter by Mr. Stephen; he impressed on the farmers the value of sheep breeding, and in that connection emphasized the value of using only good purebred stock, also taking the male lambs when quite young and fattening them by feeding on clover and rape, with the addition of a few whole oats during the month of September so as to put them on the fall market in a finished condition thereby getting a heavier lamb and a better price. He also showed the difference between the unfinished and a finished carcass, as these were kindly lent by Mr. Sullivan for the occasion. Much interest was taken in the meeting here.


