Many readers will mourn the death of elder Elias Roberts which occurred on the 28th of Nov. at the home of his son-in-law, Andrew McBae, Brookfield. The late Mr. Roberts was in many respects a remarkable man and one who has left a name and an example which will not soon be forgotten. He was born in Devonport, England on Oct. 6th 1819. He was the 7th son of late Wm. and Mrs. Roberts who immigrated to this Province settling at Murray Harbor. When Elias was but a child at the age of fifteen, largely self educated, he began teaching school, a profession which he followed with marked success for forty years. As an instance of the many changes experienced in our Island history during his life time it may be noted here that the first salary earned by him as a public school teacher was paid him in potatoes and oats. These products he conveyed to Halifax where they were converted into cash, he returning to Pictou on foot. Later he engaged in farming at Wheatley River, his efforts in this line also being characterized by his energy and thoroughness, which brought success in all his undertakings. As a Justice of the Peace away back in the days when scholars and lawyers were few he did much of the writing for the people in the districts where he taught. Being an able arbitrator and a born peace maker he settled many disputes and thus prevented many cases from going into court. In his youth he came under the influence of that great spiritual teacher and preacher, the late Rev. Donald McDonald, by whom he was ordained an elder when he was a very young man. The duties of this sacred office he continued to perform with untiring zeal and great spiritual power until laid aside by the infirmities of old age, some few months previous to his demise. In 1869 after the death of the Rev. Donald McDonald he was selected by a large number of his fellow worshippers to administer the ordinance of Baptism and the Lord's Supper and to perform such other duties as might be required of him by the church. In this capacity he labored earnestly and faithfully addressing meetings in different parts of the Province. He baptized 327 children and administered the sacrament of the Lord's Supper to many hundreds. He was an able and eloquent speaker profoundly versed in the Scriptures. His teachings will undoubtedly bear fruit in those who have had the privilege of hearing him. When nearly sixty years of age he took up the studies of the Hebrew, Greek and Latin languages mastering each so that he could easily read the scriptures in either. This assisted him greatly in his deep search after knowledge. In his teaching he was broad in his views holding out the hope of eternal salvation to every fallen descendant of Adam. He regularly visited Summerside and Searletown. His visiting to these sections were in June last where he met for the last time many of those who so highly prized his spiritual teaching and who will sincerely regret his departure. His work being done his death bed had no pain. It was but a quiet wait of a few hours for the call to rest, "the well done," to the faithful servant. He was thrice married and leaves to mourn three sons and two daughters.
