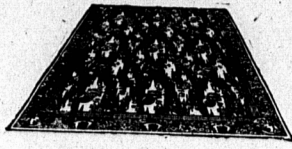

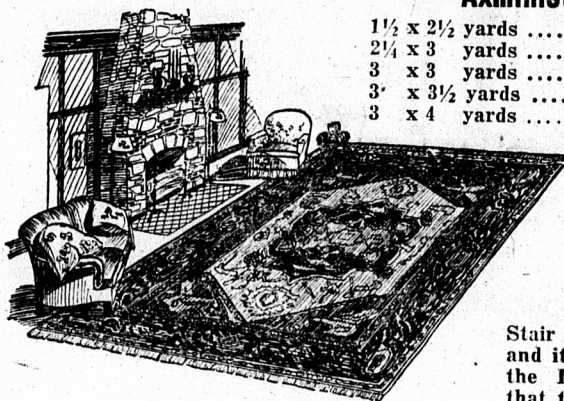

Unhappy Outlook For Lindberghs

HOPEWELL, N. J. Mar. 30—A reiteration of the belief that "No specific significance" attaches to developments in Norfolk, Va., was attributed to Col. Charles A. Lindbergh last night by Col. H. Norman Schwarzkopf, who is directing the police search for the kidnapped Lindbergh baby.
Col. Schwarzkopf was asked if Col. Lindbergh's asserted attitude was the same since Dean H. Dobson Peacock, former Canadian Rector,

upon his return to Norfolk said the flyer had asked a continuation of the southern negotiations for the baby's return.
The police head sent back the following answer:
"Upon taking the matter up with Col. Lindbergh, we find the same statement still obtains in regard to the Norfolk situation and there is nothing to add or change."
