MONCTON, N.B., Aug. 27.—In order to accommodate travel in connection with the forthcoming visit of the Governor-General to Charlottetown, the departure times of certain trains will be delayed beyond the regular scheduled leaving time from that city on Saturday next, August 31, according to an announcement from regional headquarters of the Canadian National Railways here.

OTTAWA, Aug. 27.—(CP)—The Department of National War Services tonight promulgated regulations governing the calling up of single young men for military training.

"Within the space of a few days we will know, as a result of national registration the number of single men in Canada and in each province in Canada, and in each administrative district under these regulations. We will also know the number in each age class, 18 to 45."

Noting that the first call would be made about October 1, the exemptions as listed in the regulations will be included in the first call in order to give universities a chance to furnish a list of their students.
