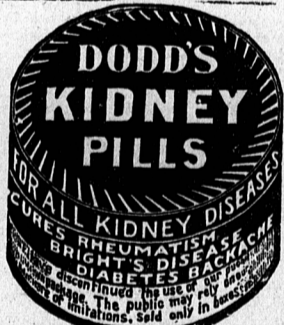
Some day a statesman will arise in Canada who will change the policy of the past with regard to the eastern Provinces, who will not stand at gaze perpetually toward the setting sun.
