HOW TO SELECT POULTRY MALES

A high point in the poultry breeders' art is the selection of approved flock breeding males. A strong vigorous male from high producing stock has a marked effect on the type and producing ability of the progeny, or fact that is demonstrated year by year in the high quality eggs which produce vigorous chicks. On the question of selection of males the poultry authorities, Dominion Department of Agriculture calls attention to the fact that progressive breeders start selecting the males when the birds are quite young, the first selection being birds that feather quickly, mature reasonably early, are black pin heads, and maintain good growth and weight for age. "Pony" type birds that show rapid masculine development but lack body size are discarded.

The following points should be noted in the selection of breeding males when final choice is made (at about six months of age): (1) appears vigorous and masculine with freedom of movement; (2) a strong vigorous male from high producing stock has a marked effect on the type and producing ability of the progeny, or fact that is demonstrated year by year in the high quality eggs which produce vigorous chicks. **Women Dealers Grace Reno's Gaming Tables**

RENO, Sept. — (C P) — Last night I graduated from a new kind of school — where arithmetic consists of adding up to twenty-one when literature is a mimeographed copy of "advice to employees" and where reading means lightning judgment of many red faces. It is now a full fledged dealer in one of Reno's biggest and most famous gambling houses, where the man whose problem has been solved by employing girl dealers for the blackjack, dice, roulette and other tables. Above the neon-lit glare, where sometimes nearly a million dollars change hands every night, there is a school to teach girls the new and lucrative profession, and the intricate details of roulette and dice betting are explained to the novice.

The excitement of the work, the high pay and novelty of such a job attract all sorts of women — shop assistants, debutantes, housewives, war brides and divorcees. They are not required to have any knowledge of games, but if with a modicum of tuition does not prove satisfactory, they most likely do not become good dealers.

**Weekly Live Stock Report**

SUMMARY

All killing classes of cattle met an active market during the week and prices paid for this quality of offerings were steady to 25 cents per cwt. higher. Total cattle receipts were around 200 less than last week, at 23,567 head. Hog prices were a shade easier in the eastern markets but remained unchanged throughout the week. The calf market remained firm, while lambs moved up 25 cents at Toronto, only to lose that gain by the end of the week, other markets remaining steady.

**Eastern Cattle Markets**

Good killing cattle were scarce at TORONTO and were absorbed at stronger prices, while several hundred head of choice steers were unsold. Weighty steers closed at \$11 to \$12.25 and one choice load made \$12.40. Butcher steers and heifers ranged from \$10 to \$11.25, with a few at \$11.50. At MONTREAL trading was slow to start, with receipts of 1,000 head, but by the date. A big percentage were of common to just medium grades and prices were steady to 25 cents lower. Quotations from the MARITIMES show choice steers and heifers at \$11 down to \$10.75, commercial \$10.50 to \$10.75, and plain \$7.50 to \$8, f.o.b. country points.

**Western Cattle Markets**

Reduced country loadings at WINNIPEG took some pressure off the cattle market, with all killing classes meeting an active trade. Prices worked fully 25 cents or more higher, which was attributed entirely to shorter runs. Despite a much smaller number of stockers and feeders, these classes made no recovery from the low selling point of last week. Plain to medium killing steers brought \$9 to \$10.75, some butcher heifers \$9.25 to \$11.25, cows and heifers downward from \$9. CALGARY remained steady to strong on good quality cattle, with cows 25 cents up to \$11.75 and a few butcher heifers up to \$11 and \$11.25, mostly \$10.75 down. Trading opened slow at EDMONTON, with a few choice under liberal receipts of mostly plain quality. Prices were steady with good killers from \$10.25 to \$11.25. PRINCE ALBERT held steady, with top butcher steers at \$10.50. MOOSE JAW stayed in line with the previous week for good quality cattle, with top killers at \$11. SASKATOON paid \$11.50 for choice steers and heifers, good quality \$11.50 to \$11.75, and top butcher steers \$11.50 to \$11.75 for good butcher steers.

**United States Market**

Dairy cattle exports to the United States during the past week ended September 23rd, with 446 in the corresponding week last year. Exports from January 1st to September 23rd this year total 23,784 against 17,890 in the same period last year.

**Calf Market Firm**

Toronto calves were firm at \$15 to \$15.50 for choice vealers, with common \$14 to \$14.50. At Montreal calves were in very good demand at \$13 to \$16 for good quality. DRY COWS were selling at \$25 to \$30, while grass calves were draggy at 50 cents lower, topping at \$45. At Winnipeg the calf market was active and firm, with best handweight vealers \$13 to \$14, mostly \$13 to \$12.50. Other vealer quotations were Calgary \$12 to \$13, Regina \$12 to \$13, Saskatoon \$12 to \$13, and Vancouver \$12 to \$13.

**ON THE FLOOR**

As I knew the game of blackjack or 21 I severely had to go through a preliminary "brushing up" period, to learn how to hold the deck of cards correctly, to remember the odds, and to keep a clear mind when dealing to as many as seven experienced players. So instead of spending several days in the school about the club, I was put on the floor immediately, working from 6.30 a. m. with forty minutes for "lunch" and a ten minute rest period every hour and a half.

I was told how to spread the cards slightly, and keep the deck tucked well down in my palm; how to deal the cards over and behind the bets when dealing, and use the wrists instead of the whole arm; how to turn over the individual hands systematically to reckon, and to learn the combination of numbers instead of counting laboriously. I discovered the dealer must "hit" on sixteen and stand on seventeen, and pay one and a half times for "blackjack".

On the surface, it all seems very simple. You must be tacitful and patient, and (within reason) let the customer think he is right. But you must also know how to signal inconspicuously for a "bounce" or "blackjack" when a player becomes obstreperous.

**Girls Stick At It**

It is hard work, exhausting and intense, but the girls do not quit. Some of the most experienced dealers have been at the club for two years and more. One girl came to Reno for a divorce, worked at the club for six weeks, remained after her divorce was granted and married one of the croupiers. Another was a dealer for awhile, is now one of the "floor bosses" in an executive position.

The money is good. You are paid \$26 a week while training, then gradual increases until you are up to the \$60 a week mark within a hundred dollars a night in tips. The small tables averaging 15 to 25 dollars. You work on eight hour shifts, as the club is open 24 hours, and pay one and a half times its quota of women dealers.
