## EFFECTS OF STARVATION

Individuals Suffer in Many Different Ways

Dr. Clara C. Benson of the department of household science of the University of Toronto, in an instructive and illustrative lecture before the Canadian Institute, traced the development of the science of nutrition. The first experiments were carried out in the United States in 1890, and all the work done in the interests of the science of nutrition has been done since then, she said. She showed by means of lantern slides and charts the amount of proteins, fats, carbohydrates in the different foods, and the work each food performs in the body.

One very interesting and instructive investigation was that dealing with starvation, which showed how the process affected the person. The results showed that the subject required at first a decreasing amount of protein each day, which element was absorbed from the body of the subject from its own economy until the tenth day, after which a small but constant supply was necessary. The amount of heat given out by the body was shown to be equal to the amount of energy obtained from the food by burning it in oxygen. The proportion of food value extracted from the constituent parts of the body was the factor which determined the extent of life in the body deprived of food, and depended on the individual condition of each person. No definite figures could be given, as each body depended for its life on its ability to supply the constituents of bodily life from its own composition, which varied in the individual.

## NEW WIRELESS DISCOVERY

An Italian Inventor Has Perfected Musical Telephone

The Italian engineer, Signor Morretti, claims to have invented a wireless apparatus by which two or more messages can be transmitted simultaneously.

The main advantage claimed for the new system is that two or three messages could be sent simultaneously at little more than the ordinary cost of one.

When a message is to be sent the operator taps his telegraph key, and this liberates compressed air, which passes through a reed pipe, causing it to emit a musical note. Receiving telephones have been made which will only respond to one particular note.

When two messages are to be sent simultaneously two operators' keys operate different reed pipes, and thus messages in two distinct musical notes are transmitted, each being detected by the telephone receiver in tune with it.
