Rev. Dr. Heartz, was a passenger to Charlottetown by the Northumberland Wednesday evening from the Mainland.

On Wednesday the Northumberland left Charlottetown at 8.30 a. m. for Picton with passengers, mail, express and freight and arrived at 12 noon. She left again at 5.05 p. m. with passengers, mail, express and freight and arrived at 8.25 p. m.

At the last meeting of the City Council a letter was read from the Fire Insurance Companies, with regard to the proposed increased Tax on Companies. The letter pointed out that the tax paid by Insurance Companies in Charlottetown is higher than the taxes in other Cities and an increase of 50 per cent is to be added to this tax the Companies are forced to increase rates 10 per cent As a City the size of Charlottetown should keep its fire fighting apparatus up-to-date, it was held out by the Fire Companies, as an inducement that if a Chemical Engine was installed the insurance rates would be increased only 5 per cent instead of 10 per cent. Some satisfactory assurance should therefore be given, the Fire Underwriters that a Chemical Engine will be installed by the City in order to save property-holders considerable increase in premium rates.

Rev. S. L. Teed yesterday celebrated the 87th anniversary of his birth and received the congratulations of many friends. At 5 o'clock in the afternoon he was waited on at his residence by Pastor Eatty and Messrs Geo. J. Oulton and F. A. McCully as a committee representing the Central Methodist church, and after appropriate greetings an address was read. Mr. Teed replied in happy terms, referring to his long connection with the church he loved in a very thank full spirit and expressing his deep gratitude for the thoughtfulness of friends and the many acts of kindness of which he had been recipient. Mr. Teed who has been an honored member of the N. B. and P. E. Methodist Conference over sixty years, has had charge of many important circuits and has given efficient service with excellent results. For many years his effect form was a familiar figure on the street of Moncton, and he has many friends among all classes of citizens. For the last year or two he has been in failing health and for some months past has been confined to his residence but those who called on him yesterday not only found him in a cheerful frame of mind but much stronger than they had expected. Moncton expressed his congratulations.

A Portland, Oregon, despatch to a Los Angeles, Cal., paper notes the illness of Rev. W. B. Hinson, well known in Charlottetown: "It is no known just how serious Dr. Hinson's condition may be. All in touch with the situation admit that he is suffering from overwork. He has been doing three men's work, one of the church officers declared, Dr. Hinson himself makes light of the situation. He declares he feels perfectly well. Outside of this, he is not inclined to discuss the situation, and many of those closely in touch with Dr. Hinson are likewise reticent. "Dr. E. P. Shepherd, who was called by Dr. Hinson about a year ago to treat a severe cold, says he warned him that he must be careful not to overwork because of abnormal blood pressure which might lead to serious results. Fred Johnson, a member of the White Temple executive committee, admitted today that Dr. Hinson had said that his present physician told him that he had hardening of the veins. Medical men declare that unless great care is taken this malady, allied with the abnormal blood pressure may lead to apoplexy. Dr. Hinson and his friends all declare that a present he is apparently strong, and able to do a strenuous day's work. The despatch also stated that while Mr. Hinson would not resign his pastorate an assistant would probably be appointed. Mr. Hinson's relatives and friends in Moncton have received no information as to his illness.

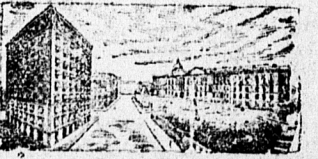
