

CHEESE BOARD MEET

The first meeting of the Board was held June 15th, 1900. A large number of salesmen and others interested were present. John Anderson, Kensington, was elected President, Dugald Currie, New Dominion, Vice-President; Robert Jenkins, Mount Albion, Secretary-Treasurer; A. B. Dickieson, New Glasgow, Auditor.

On motion it was agreed that 20 cables be received from the Trade Bulletin, Montreal, at a cost of \$30. The Board also agreed to pay the cost of transmission from Montreal.

Fourteen meetings were held and 32 factories joined the Board. The following paid their membership fee of three dollars: East River, Cardigan, Oswald, St. George's, Red Point, Dundas, Winsloe, New Glasgow, Orwell, Head St. Peter's, New Perth, Belle River, Montague, East Point, Hampton, Cornwall, Stanley Bridge, Kensington, Souris East, New Dominion, (Lot 16 Dy Ass), Red House, Dunstaffnage, Wiltshire, Hazelbrook, Hillsboro, Dunk River, Morell, Vernon River and Mt. Stewart.

The number of cheese boarded was 62,440, and the number sold on the board 29,124.

It does not necessarily follow that 33,316 cheese were sold or that 33,316 were left the same number on one board day to another, and thus the same cheese were counted twice and sometimes oftener. The percentage of sales was better than last year. Many of the leading factories sold all or about all the output on the board.

The highest price paid was 11 1/2 and the lowest 9 1/2; the average price was 10 1/5. The buyers were Dillon & Spillet, Horace Haszard, A. J. Biffin, Carvell Bros. and Auld Bros.

A PROCLAMATION

By His Honour PETER ADOLPHUS McINTYRE, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Prince Edward Island, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, the Legislative Assembly of this Province stands prorogued until Tuesday, the Eighteenth day of December, next.

I have thought fit, by and with the advice and consent of Her Majesty's Executive Council of this Province, to dissolve the said Legislative Assembly, and the same is hereby dissolved accordingly.

And I do hereby give notice to the members for the several Electoral Districts and Towns and Royalities, within the said Province that they are hereby discharged from further attendance in the said Legislative Assembly.

And I do further declare that I have given orders, that Writs calling a Legislative Assembly be issued in due form, the said Writs to bear date the Fourteenth day of November, instant, and to be returnable on Wednesday, the Second day of January, A. D., 1901, of which all persons concerned, are required to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

Given under my hand and the Great Seal of this Province, at Charlottetown, in the said Province, this Thirtieth day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred, and in the Sixty-fourth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
