J. ISRAEL TARTE.

Hon. J. I. Tarte has given out that he will not be a candidate in the coming elections. This involves his retirement from Parliament, where for years past he has been such a conspicuous and interesting figure. Very few Canadian public men have had so varied a career. He was born on a farm at Lanoraie, Quebec nearly fifty-six years ago. His good progress at school induced his parents to send him to L'Assomption College. He first chose the law as his life calling and was admitted to practice in 1871. But the farmer's son was no more destined to be a lawyer than a farmer. He was to find a field for his clear brain, his fine talents and his great energy in journalism and political life.

At St. Lin, near Montreal he drifted into journalism and became editor of a weekly journal, Les Laurentides. Here his articles attracted attention and he was called to Quebec to conduct, first Le Canadien and afterwards L'Evenement in which he continued for years and became known as a strong, incisive political writer. In Quebec the newspaper writer drifts easily into politics. Mr. Tarte was ambitious. In 1875 he offered himself as a candidate for the centre division in the House of Commons. In his address to the electors, he declared himself "the uncompromising enemy of jobbery and corruption." But his chances of election were not good and he retired before polling day. He was at this time a Conservative and one of the organizers for his party in the Quebec district. He next turned his attention to provincial affairs and was returned to the Quebec Legislature for Bonaventure in 1877. He was re-elected the following year and continued to sit in that body down to the close of 1881.

Ten years were devoted to journalism and in 1891 he was returned to the Commons for Montmoyency as an Independent Conservative and promptly declared war "against the corrupt influences which he knew were ruling the Quebec end of Sir John Macdonald's Government," as he fought out his fight to a finish in which Sir Hector Langevin was thrust, out of the Cabinet and McGreevey expelled from the House. Conservative to Liberal was not a far call. Mr. Tarte became a follower of Mr. Laurier. He organized Quebec for his new chief and fought for him on the platform and in the press with singular zeal, fidelity and ability. He shared in the Liberal triumph and became Minister of Public Works in the new Cabinet, a position which he administered with energy and success.

Mr. Tarte was always a protectionist, as Sir Wilfrid Laurier had been in his younger days. To him is in large part due the fact that the tariff was but moderately lowered under the Liberal regime. He would, indeed have advanced it again, and entered upon a propaganda to that end during the absence of Sir Wilfrid Laurier in Europe. This led to his being asked to resign on the Premier's return. Then for a time he and his powerful organ, La Patrie, inclined to opposition. The Conservatives fought for his aid in the coming election as a speaker and organizer, but the result of the by-elections in Quebec last winter had proved disappointing to Mr. Tarte. The loss of his wife had called off his attention for a time from political affairs. If late there were indications that he would not actively oppose the Liberal party. This seems now to be settled, and must have an important bearing upon the contest in Quebec Province.

DEATH OF A KING.

DRESDEN, Saxony, Oct. 15.—The new King of Saxony, Frederick A. Augustus, eldest son of King George who died early today received the ministers and officers of the Royal household later in the day and fixed the period of mourning at twenty-four weeks. The shutters are up at all the shop windows, flags are at half mast and the bells tolling.

FROM DRINKING TEA.

ST. PAUL, Minn., Oct. 16.—Mrs Anna Fitch was sent to the Rochester insane asylum today by Judge Probert. Yellow streaks in the wall paper of her room caused her insanity, though the tea habit is alleged really to be responsible for her condition.

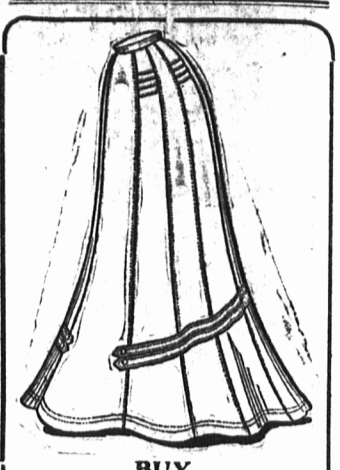
