# HOW TO BUY BY GRADE

When ordering your beef, eggs, poultry, canned fruits and vegetables, ask for the quality you want by grade—then look for the grade mark on your purchase. When you buy by grade you buy with confidence.

## BEEF

The Government grade of Beef are RED BRAND - BLUE BRAND every cut. BLUE BRAND, "Good" quality, is marked with a red ribbon-like stamp, so that part of this grade mark remains visible on

## EGGS

The Government grade of Eggs are GRADE "A" - GRADE "B" - GRADE "C" GRADE "A" (three sizes: Large, Medium, Pullet), best quality, suitable for poaching, boiling, frying; GRADE "B", good quality, slightly inferior to Grade "A" for poaching, boiling, frying, but entirely suitable for cooking purposes; GRADE "C", lowest grade, quality, (Grade "A", Large, Medium, Pullet, finest quality fresh eggs from Government inspected flocks, are available in limited quantities in certain localities. Grade names are marked clearly on egg containers.

## POULTRY

The Government grade of Poultry are GRADE "A" - GRADE "B" - GRADE "C" GRADE "A", superb birds, well-fleshed, especially fattened for tenderness and flavor; GRADE "B", good birds, but not as well-fleshed, fattened or not fattened as Grade "A"; GRADE "C", lowest grade quality. Graded poultry may be identified readily by a colored tag on the wing or breast of the bird. Red for Grade "A" - Blue for "B" - Yellow for "C".

## CANNED FRUITS AND VEGETABLES

The Government grade of Canned Fruits and Vegetables are FANCY QUALITY - CHOICE QUALITY - STANDARD QUALITY

FANCY QUALITY, packed from a selection of the best fruit and vegetables available; practically uniform in maturity and free from blemishes; uniform in size and color; canned at the proper time so that excellence of flavour and appearance may be preserved. CHOICE QUALITY, packed from fruit and vegetables selected for tenderness and flavor. Not as uniform as "Fancy Quality"; allows slight variation in size, color and maturity. STANDARD QUALITY, packed from fruit and vegetables of good quality but not necessarily meeting the higher grade requirements as to size, colour and maturity.

## CREAMERY BUTTER

The Government grade of Creamery Butter are FIRST GRADE - SECOND GRADE - THIRD GRADE FIRST GRADE—highest quality; excellent flavour; well made; smooth, waxy texture; uniform in colour. SECOND GRADE—usually inferior in flavour; texture or colour.

# GRAND MURRY Silver Jubilee REPORT HEARD

The report on Canadian Industries was read by Mrs. John A. MacDonald in the absence of Mrs. John R. Stewart, Georgetown, provincial convener of Canadian Industries. Mrs. John A. MacDonald, Cardigan, read the committee's report. This was followed by the report of Provincial Supervisor Mrs. M. G. Macdonald, Miss Mary G. Macdonald.

## Munn Appeal Case Occupies Second Day At Supreme Court

The Supreme Court yesterday heard the report of the Grand Jury and continued the appeal case, the King vs. William Munn. Cross examination of Detective Corporal F. D. Cordwell was completed. Other witnesses heard included Constables H. W. Carson, C. F. Deakin, A. Shaw and P. L. Jay, all members of the Charlottetown detachment Royal Canadian Mounted Police. Their evidence completed the case for the Crown. Mr. J. J. Johnston, counsel for the appellant was delivering his argument by a motion that the appeal be allowed when court adjourned last evening. As Mr. Justice A. C. Saunders, who is presiding, will be unable to attend when Court resumes this morning the case was set at the foot of the docket for completion of argument by counsel for the appellant and Hon. T. A. Campbell, attorney general on behalf of the Crown.

The Munn case involves an appeal from a conviction by the St. John's Police of Charlottetown on a charge of obstructing peace officer. The case arose out of a search of premises at 251 Campbell street for liquor by members of the Mounted Police last February. With the consent of Mr. R. R. Bell, counsel for the appellant, a motion to amend was allowed by the Court in the case the King vs. James Monaghan. This was an appeal from a conviction by the St. John's Police of Charlottetown imposing a sentence of \$60 and costs or 60 days in jail for a vagrancy charge. The sentence was amended to \$10 and costs or 10 days in jail.

The Court allowed a motion dismissing without costs the appeal case of the King vs. James Monaghan. The Attorney General announced his motion for dismissal was being made with the consent of Mr. Bell, counsel for the appellant. Mr. Justice Saunders who presided yesterday adjourned Court until 10:30 this morning, when it is likely to hear the King vs. Monaghan case under the Exchequer Act.

## 3rd Reading Of National Park Bill In Senate

In the Senate on June 17 the National Park Amendment Bill was given third reading. Dandurand, Government leader said in part:

"The main purpose of this Bill is to make some corrections in the boundaries of the park in Prince Edward Island. As honorable members are aware, the Government of Prince Edward Island has acquired or acquired the areas that are to be included in the Dominion administration and the development of a national park in this province. This involved the acquisition of property of various persons, and in the adjustments incidental to the acquisition necessary to change the boundaries of the areas acquired."

"The honorable members are aware, the honorable senator from Prince (Hon. Mr. MacArthur), a couple of years ago very generously presented to the Government of this province a plan to acquire the areas that are to be included in the Dominion administration and the development of a national park in this province. This involved the acquisition of property of various persons, and in the adjustments incidental to the acquisition necessary to change the boundaries of the areas acquired."

"We have inspected the renovated Court House Building and are very pleased with the improvement that has been made. We also visited and inspected Falconwood Hospital, Infirmary and the Queen's County Jail, and found them well kept and in good clean condition."

"I wish to recommend the following: That monthly visitations be made to these institutions by a commission of three appointed by the Government. The farm buildings at Falconwood be repaired and put in good condition; that doors and windows be painted, and the walls whitewashed. The men conform to the present surroundings."

"We recommend that a separate building should be erected for housing the nursing staff of Falconwood institution which will greatly relieve the present congested condition of the institution and assist in the health and comfort of the patients."

"The number of patients in Falconwood Hospital is 132 females and 132 males. In the Queen's County Jail, 25 males and five females."

"We wish to commend the doctors and excellent men in which they perform their duties."
