**THE TWELFTH OF JULY.**

By some persons who have not given attention to the facts of history the Orange anniversary, which takes place today, is believed to be the anniversary of the battle of the Boyne. The fact is that the battle of the Boyne was fought on July 1st, 1690 and its anniversary therefore falls on the same date with the natal day of the Dominion. At the battle of the Boyne, as is well known, William III defeated his father-in-law, James II. The latter fled to Dublin thence to Waterford, from which port he set sail for France.

The annual celebrations of the Twelfth of July are in memory of the battle of Aughrim, which was fought on Sunday, July 12, 1691. In this battle the troops of William III, commanded by General Ginkell, gained a complete victory over the army of James II. The chief immediate result was the submission of Ireland to William III, earlier known as Prince of Orange.

The name Orangemen, like that of Christian, was bestowed upon them by their enemies, on account of their support of William, Prince of Orange. It was first assumed in 1795, more than a hundred years after the battle of the Boyne, as the designation of a political party by the Protestants who formed loyal associations in opposition to the Society of the United Irishmen, the latter body having been organized in 1791, for the purpose of creating an insurrection and establishing a republic in connection with France.

Orangeism as a secret, politico-religious society was instituted in Ireland in 1795. It was organized for the purpose of upholding the Protestant religion and ascendancy, and of opposing Romanism and the Roman Catholic influence in the government of the country. The first Orange lodge, was formed at Armagh, September the 21st, 1795, and the Duke of York became a patron in 1797. The order fell into comparative neglect after the end of the war with Napoleon in 1815. Its revival dates from a great Orange meeting held in Dublin in September, 1828, when the acceptance by the Duke of Cumberland of the office of Grand Master was announced.

The legality of the Orange organization was the subject of a protracted debate in the House of Commons in 1835, and a series of resolutions against the lodges was adopted in February 1836. Many magistrates were dismissed in 1845 because they were members of Orange lodges. More recently, as the aims and principles of the order came to be better understood, and the asperities growing out of the faction fights of earlier days had worn off, the Loyal Orange Association, as we know it now, came to be a recognized institution almost wherever the English language is spoken. Although still most numer-

ous in Ulster, Ireland, the lodges exist today all over the British Empire and in many parts of the United States.

William, Prince of Orange, was born at The Hague, Nov. 14 1650; died at Kensington, March 8 1702. He was King of England from 1689 to 1702. His father, William II of the United Netherlands, died before his birth. His mother was Mary, daughter of Charles I of England. William III, who was known as Prince of Orange before he became King, married in 1677 Mary, daughter of James II. He died in consequence of a fall from his horse, leaving no heirs.
