DELEGATIONS RECEIVED—Dr. Pethick, V. S., waited upon the executive of the government last week with respect to the establishment of a Quarantine Station for toxes here and also of a Federal Experimental station. The Doctor was informed by the Premier that these had been arranged for; they are located on the farm of Mr. F. W. Burke, Charlottetown Royal ty. Dr. Allan will have charge of these stations. The G.W.V.A., through Major Cyrus MacMillan, Colonel Prosser, Dr. Ross, Lieutenant Stewart and Lieutenant Weeks, presented the claims of returned soldiers for any vacancies that might occur, but they did not ask that any man be dismissed to make way for the returned soldiers. They also asked for the Government's recognition and sympathy for the returned men. The Premier declared that the returned men are ready to have the sympathy and recognition of the Government and this principle would continue. The delegation then thanked the government, and retired.
