

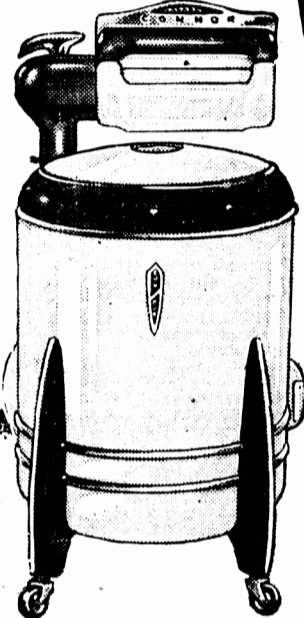

### Islanders I Have Met

By 'Islander Abroad'

WINNIPEG, Man. — One afternoon last week, I called at "The Toronto Trusts Building", on Portage Ave., on a visit with Dr. J. A. MacDougall, formerly of Newtown, Belfast, P. E. I.

When I entered the waiting room, just outside his office on the fifth floor of the Building, seeing quite a few waiting to interview Dr. MacDougall, I asked the nurse, if he were too busy to say "Hello," explaining I came on a social mission only, that I was from Dr. MacDougall's native province, and that I knew members of the MacDougall family.

While waiting to meet Dr. MacDougall, a lady in the waiting room spoke to me, asking about P. E. I. and the MacDougall family. Afterwards I learned that she is a stepdaughter of the late Mrs. Hardy, a sister of Dr. MacDougall. Dr. MacDougall being quite busy that afternoon was free to chat for a few moments only, and we made arrangements to have lunch together, which we did two days later at "The Honey Dew," where we had a real old-fashioned "coo flab" about the Island.

Dr. MacDougall related to me many incidents of his boyhood days about Belfast — forgetting not, his fishing days at Anderson's Dam, and the gathering of oysters off the rocks in Orwell Bay.

Dr. MacDougall has his residence on Wolsey Ave., a very beautiful section of the city, quite near the banks of the Assiniboine River, and has a large summer cottage at the Lake.

Mrs. MacDougall has been quite ill in the hospital, and is now recuperating at her home, being cared for by their only daughter who relinquished her position in her father's office to be home with her mother.

Dr. MacDougall has four sisters, Mrs. Smith of Charlottetown, M.S. MacLean of Mt. Herbert, P. E. I., Mrs. MacLeod of Calgary, Alberta, and a sister in the Eastern States; and two brothers, Herman of Newtown, P. E. I., and Harry of Charlottetown, who operates a men's clothing store. A brother Aris, who was a contractor and built a house away in late fall of 1947 in Charlottetown.

### Level Piracy Charges Against Russia, Poland

STOCKHOLM, March 29 — (CP) — The unexplained disappearance of the crews of two Swedish cargo vessels in the Baltic have led to accusations of "piracy" against Russia and Poland in the Swedish press.

Seamen are becoming increasingly nervous of Polish ports which, they say, are "unsafe."

Both vessels — the Kinnekulle and the Iwan — left Stolpmuende, Poland, Feb. 18 bound for Sweden.

The Kinnekulle was later found near the Danish island of Bornholm abandoned by her crew. There were signs of an explosion in the engine room but the machinery itself was intact and the vessel seaworthy.

The Iwan has not been traced but a waterlogged lifeboat, a life-belt and pieces of wreckage bearing her name suggest she has foundered.

Sweden's right-wing and centre press is suggesting that Russian naval units may have "captured" the two vessels and abducted their crews. Two members of the Iwan's crew were Estonians who fled to Sweden when their country was incorporated into the Soviet Union in 1940.

On the Kinnekulle a woman's shoes and underclothing of Polish origin found in the crew's quarters are believed here to indicate that a Polish refugee was on board.

So far, the Swedish Foreign Office has refused to comment on these accusations of what the People's Party paper Aftonbladet describes as "piracy in the Baltic." It has, however, instructed the Embassies in Moscow and Warsaw and the Consulate in Gdynia to ascertain whether any Swedish seamen have been picked up by Russian or Polish vessels.

The Swedish Foreign Office is also investigating reports in the Conservative newspaper Svenska Dagbladet that Stolpmuende harbor was cordoned off and Russian guards posted on the Fran's decks on the day she sailed. These reports are based on the testimony of the crews of other Swedish ships which were berthed at Stolpmuende at the same time.

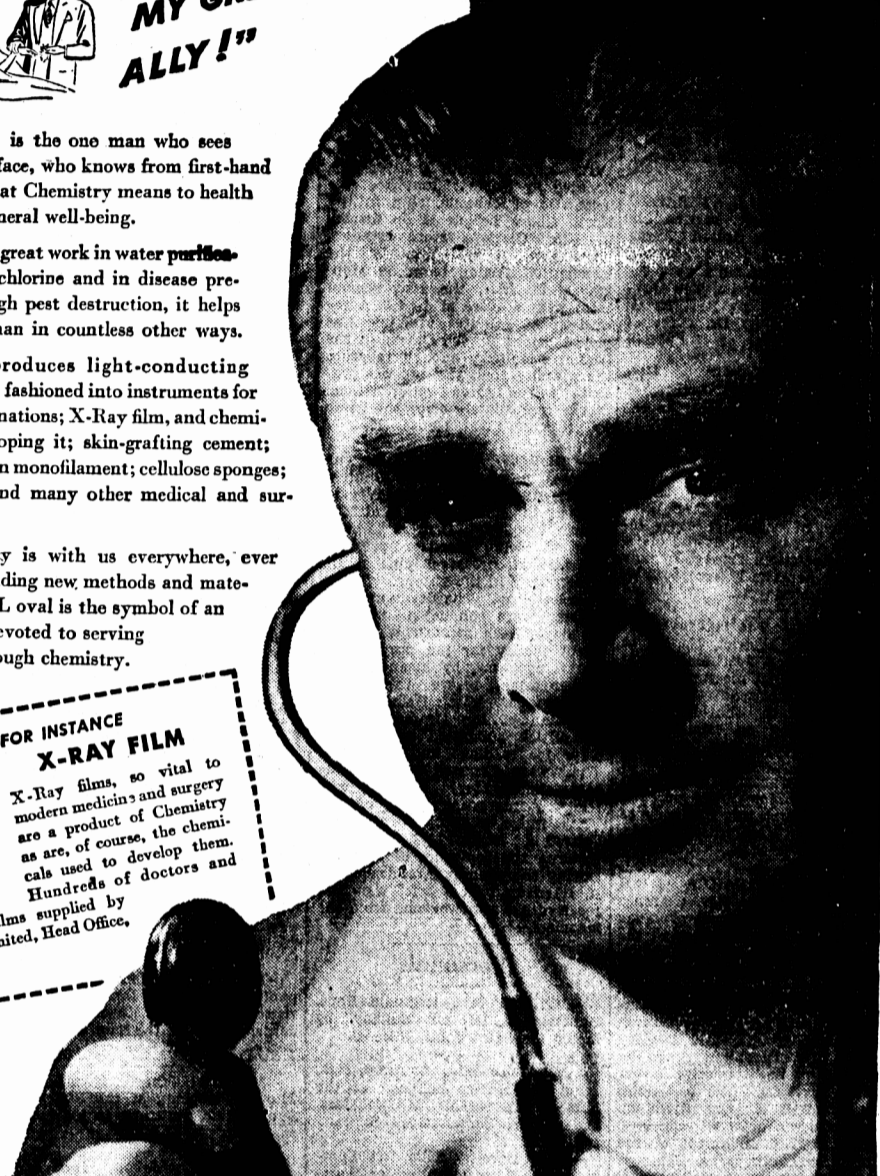

Goldstein and Schiff parted with portions of their holdings at Vecek's request. Both are close friends of the Tribe president and complied with his requests as a personal favor.
