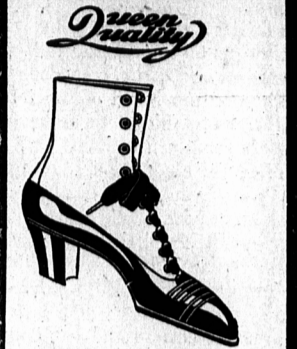

The local Legislature adjourned yesterday at 6 p. m. until 3 p. m. tomorrow, in order to enable the members to attend the Provincial Seed Fair at Summerside today.

The remarkably mild spring like weather of Sunday and Monday has been succeeded by a slightly colder spell. On Monday night the temperature went down to 23 above zero. It rose a few degrees yesterday but at nine last night it was 18 degrees above.

A. A. Lefurgey, M. P. in speaking on behalf of the men from Prince Edward Island who fought in South Africa, said in the House of Commons recently: There is no way by which the Dominion can give a land grant to the volunteers from those provinces except by giving them land in the Northwest. Large slices of rich territory in the west are being apportioned to the provinces. Ontario is to get a good slice, and Quebec is looking anxiously toward Ungava. In all these provinces are lands from which rewards can be given for such services as we are rendering to-day. If it is of the Maritime provinces have a share to these rich territories, we could remunerate our men in the same substantial way. But we have at these lands. That does not alter the fact that the men from the Maritime provinces rendered the same service as those from other parts of the Dominion, and should be treated on an equality with them. Let us deal with this matter in a straightforward way, on a scheme that will benefit the Dominion.
