SIGNALLER LYMAN WOOD.

Mr. and Mrs. Geo. Wood, North Tryon, received a telegram from Ottawa on May 18th informing them that their son, Signaller John Lyman Wood had on May 3rd closed up his life, a sacrifice for the cause of justice and freedom on the battlefield of Flanders in one of the recent battles against the Huns. He enlisted October 1915, at the beginning of his eighteenth year along with other college men from Acadia College, Wolfville, N. S., of which college he was a Sophomore. He spent only a short time training with the 4th University Company at Montreal, completing his course in England, arriving on the scene of battle Dec. 24th 1916. He did his duty as a signaller continually and saw much and heavy fighting, till he fell in action in the noble effort to vindicate the cause of outraged humanity. His fine character had made him many friends among those with whom he came in contact and more especially his fellow students. It also helped him to face the dangers of battle, and at last his God.

The sympathy of the community is extended to his parents and relatives in their sad bereavement.
