ROSEBERY ADDRESSES IMPERIALIST LIBERALS

At a Dinner of the Liberal League He Says the North Leeds Election Dealt a Great Blow to the Government.

LONDON, Aug. 1.—Lord Rosebery presided at a largely attended dinner of the Liberal League last evening, at which the Right Hon. Herbert H. Asquith, Sir Edward Grey, Bart., Sir Henry H. Fowler, Richard B. Haldane, and other prominent Liberals were present.

Lord Rosebery in the course of a lengthy speech dilated upon the recent bye election at North Leeds, which resulted in the return of Roland Barran, Liberal. Mr. Barran sat at Lord Rosebery's right. The speaker characterized the North Leeds verdict as having greater significance than any single election since Mr. Gladstone was first returned from Midlothian, and as almost a vital blow to the prestige of the Government.

Yet, Lord Rosebery warned his hearers, fifty such elections as that in North Leeds might not turn out the party now in power. It showed, however, that the nation was beginning to look dispassionately at the Government's record in domestic legislation and to judge with cooler temper than it could during the South African war. The Liberal Party had suffered a long

period of sterility; it had been going through the valley of the shadow of death from want of concentration, and it had been allowing itself to become dissociated from the imperial aspirations of the nation. The party had suffered, continued the speaker, by its unfortunate attitude in regard to the Irish question, and until imperialist Liberal principles prevailed within it there would be necessity for the continued existence of the Liberal League, which, Lord Rosebery said, did not threaten internal disunion, but formed a rallying point for those sharing the principles of its promoters.

Announcement is made that Earl Beauchamp has joined the Liberal League. This formal defection from the Conservative ranks, coming at a moment when excitement is rife over the Liberal victory in North Leeds, occasions considerable interest in political circles. It is regarded as noteworthy that Lord Beauchamp, at the request of Colonial Secretary Chamberlain and to judge with cooler temper than it could during the South African war. He resigned that office in March, 1900.

THE NILE DAM AT ASSOUAN FINISHED

One of the Greatest Engineering Works of Any Age Completed Months in Advance of the Stipulated Date—Sir John Aird the Contractor.

LONDON, Aug. 1.—The Times announces that the last coping stone of the Nile dam at Assouan was laid on Wednesday.

The Nile Reservoir, for which the great dams at Assouan and Assiout have been constructed, will enable wide tracks of land to bear two crops a year instead of one, will bring waste districts into tillage and greatly increase the area of sugar cultivation. The reservoir will supply 1,000,000,000 cubic meters of water annually.

The dam at Assouan is 1 1/2 miles long. It is pierced by 180 openings, 23 feet side and 7 feet wide, which have steel sluice gates. The news that the Nile Reservoir was to be begun was contained in the announcement on Feb. 20, 1898, to the effect that the Khedive in Council had approved a contract with John Aird & Co., which settled the much debated question. Sir John Aird, Bart., is the Mayor of Paddington, and when Lord Kitchener arrived in London a few days ago he asked Sir John, who presented an address of

welcome to him, how the work at Assouan was progressing.

The contract called for the completion of the two dams in five years from July 1, 1898, and the contractors agreed to accept payments by annual instalments of £160,000, beginning on the completion of the dams and extending over thirty years—a total of £4,800,000. Sir Benjamin Baker is the chief engineer of the scheme.

Work was begun immediately after the contract had been signed, and about a year ago it was stated that progress had been so much more rapid than had been expected that there was reason to believe that the undertaking would be completed six months earlier than was originally thought possible.

Continuous employment on the Assouan dam has been given for the last eighteen months to 16,000 operatives, 90 per cent of whom are Egyptians.

The entire work at Assouan will be finished, in Sir John Aird's opinion, by the end of the year.
