The greatest interest of the day, or of the entire show to date, was evidenced when the standard platinum silver classes were called. These new types certainly appeal to the imagination and to the eye and the word "beautiful" could be heard many times during the afternoon, particularly from the feminine portion of the spectators.

First class adult males was won by McLure & MacKinnon, J. R. Lockery winning the adult female class and Ernest T. Mill the pup male class; D. O. Stewart the pup female class; Light standard platinum silver was won by McLure & MacKinnon; adult females light standard platinum silver went to Raoul Raymond with Swissvale DCY-318X.
