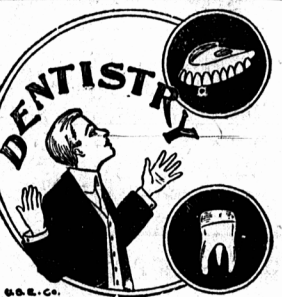

Dredge No. 10 has put through one cut of one mile and a quarter at Mt. Stewart and is now engaged dredging a channel at Gills' wharf.

Rev. Father Powell of England, who has been preaching to large congregations in St. Peter's Cathedral, Charlottetown, left this morning for Summerside.

J. W. Richards, member for Prince county, (P. E. I.), and Mrs. Richards, of Biddeford, (P. E. I.), have arrived in the city and are staying at the Alexandria for the season.—Ottawa Ex.

The eastern express arrived in Charlottetown today at 9.30 a. m. on time; the southern accommodation at 10.30 a. m., fifty-five minutes late, and the Cape Traverse accommodation at 10.05 a. m., ten minutes late.

The following extract from the Maritime Merchant will be of general interest here:—There has been about ten cargoes of Island produce in Halifax so far this fall and a few more are expected. Taking it altogether the number of vessels will probably be less than an average season. On account of a difficulty in getting vessels. The supply of Island potatoes has been good so far, and there has been a fair demand, particularly in view of the fact that a couple of cargoes were taken for export from this time on the demand will be better. Crops of all kinds of Island produce are considered to be good. It is possible, though that the farmers are holding back again this fall. A year ago there was talk of scarcity, but when the spring came with the high prices, there was plenty of supplies found for shipment to the western markets, perhaps the recollection of that experience makes the farmers none too anxious to bring out their supplies this fall. Present wholesale prices of potatoes at the wharves run about 40 cents; Turnips are sold at the usual price of 25 cents; Oats run from 55 to 56 cents. Shipments of Island oats so far have been rather light.

The Maritime Provinces are likely to play an important part at the annual meeting here this afternoon of the Amateur Athletic Union of Canada. Dr. H. Johnson, of Charlottetown, P. E. I., who will represent the Maritime branch, will ask for a new definition of an amateur. The suggestion will come more to encourage capable and qualified men in accepting positions as instructors of physical culture than anything else. It is probable, also, that a bid may be made to have the presidency of the Union go to the East. When the amalgamation between the C. A. A. and Amateur Athletic Federation was brought about in 1909, it was understood that the honors would alternate between the various provinces. Since that the presidency has been held by an Ontario man and the other branches will support Quebec in aving that the office be held here next season, and in the Maritime or Western Provinces, the following year. The West, Maritime and the Quebec branches will stand together in asking for a change in the amateur definition. The delegates from all three are of opinion that if amateurs were allowed to compete with professionals under certain conditions it would further the interests of not only track and field athletics but many of the various other sports.
