THE OPPOSITION LEADERSHIP.

The definite decision of Sir Charles Tupper to retire from political life is not surprising in view of his advanced age and long and able public service. Probably no one of the younger members of either party put forth such strenuous efforts during the campaign, or covered so large a part of the country as did the veteran Conservative Chief. He has done what he could, and no man of his party could have done more or probably as much as he to achieve success. Besides, his cheerful manner of accepting defeat without bitterness has created a warm feeling of regard for him throughout the country and many of those who were politically opposed to him will regret the withdrawal of so conspicuous a figure from Canadian public life. He has made his exit with the dignity befitting a long and eminent career.

Sir Charles Tupper's retirement involves the selection of a new leader for the Conservative party in Canada, and speculation is already alert as to the probable choice. Under ordinary conditions one of three or four persons would be clearly indicated, but the conditions are not ordinary; they are extraordinary. In the first place all the men of the first rank and many of the second rank have met defeat at the polls. In the next place it will be observed that three fourths of the members who will represent the Conservative party in the new Parliament come from the single Province of Ontario, and of these something more than one half were not in the last House. Of the entire party throughout the Dominion very nearly one half are new men. These facts must have an important bearing upon the choice of a new leader.

Had Sir Charles Tupper retired before the late election and had the choice of a new leader been then made the lot would almost certainly have fallen upon one of the three men, Hon. Hugh John Macdonald, Hon. George E. Foster or Sir Wilfrid Laurier, with the chances best in the order that their names are here set down. But all those men have been defeated. Hon. Hugh John Macdonald hardly sustained the party expectations during the campaign, and hence the choice is now less likely to fall upon him than it was before. Mr. Foster is not only defeated but has failed to carry more than one third of his Province. Sir Wilfrid Laurier is in the same plight with this weight added that he is the son of a leader who has met with two successive defeats. The Ontario Conservatives have clearly the right as well as the absolute control of the situa-

tion so far as choosing a leader is concerned.

But the Ontario Conservatives have not among their members elect any one man who fills the public eye as a prospective leader. Hon John Haggart is ambitious and may press his claims, but he can hardly do so successfully. Sir Mackenzie Bowell, had he not once been Premier and embroiled with his colleagues, might now be selected, but is not likely to be under the circumstances, nor would he, nor Hon. Clarke Wallace probably consent to the selection of either Mr. Foster or Sir Wilfrid Laurier. The situation is therefore both difficult and complicated. We note that some of the Quebec Conservatives are pointing out these difficulties and urging the selection of a French Canadian leader as the best solution on the ground that such a choice would afford the only hope of restoring the party prospects in their Province and making headway against the great influence of Sir Wilfrid Laurier there.
