NEW YORK, N. Y., Aug. 28—After a quiet and well distributed rally in the morning yesterday, the market experienced a sharp selling wave of large volume which cut prices sharply lower. The first wave developed around noon, the second in the early afternoon and the third toward the close. The last decline did not carry prices much, if any, below lows made in the early afternoon.

So far there seems to have been no impairment of the favorable outlook for business later this fall, but the action of the market yesterday suggests some further readjustment of prices. Technically, the ability of the market to hold of the lows of a week ago would improve the outlook.
