IN MEMORIAM

DR. R. A. DONAHUE

Many citizens here will learn with deep regret of the death from pneumonia in Sa-katchewan of Dr. Robert Donahue, formerly of Rose-nath near Cardigan, who visited here only last summer. The doctor leaves to mourn besides his wife and three children, three sisters, Mrs. Wm. Cain, New Perth; Katie at home and Mary, who with her brother, Rev. James Donahue will accompany the remains to this province for burial. Another brother Thomas resides on the homestead. The remains are expected to arrive here next Monday evening. Dr. Donahue has many friends here and was widely known being one of the Island's foremost athletes while attending St. Dunstan's College. He was for many years also a prominent member of the Abegweit Athletic Club and for some years was the champion all-round athlete of the province, capturing medals in abundance both in this and the neighboring provinces for his feats of skill and endurance.

JAMES HENRY ROBBINS

The death occurred at his home in Morell East of James Henry Robbins at the early age of fifty-four years. Although not in the best of health for upwards of two years, hopes remained for his recovery until about three months ago, when he gradually grew worse until the end came on Oct. 2.
