## NEW ALL-ROUND CHAMPION OF AMERICA

NEW YORK, July 14.—To win the all-round amateur championship of America has been the dream of many a brawny athlete, but to see a wiry Irishman walk out on a field with a broad smile on his face, Martin J. Sheridan did in Brookline, Mass., on Saturday, and break the record for the title by 400 points, was something none of the spectators ever thought of.  
This giant, clean-jimbed and long-limbed won 633 1/2 points so easily that his performance was little short of marvellous. He was a new man to the all-round event, and not many people present knew him. Some one said he was a New York discus-thrower, and volunteered the suggestion before the games that he was probably a muscle-bound weight-lifter. But Sheridan proved far different.  
At the start he qualified in the 100-yard dash; then he won the 10-pound shot put, tied in the running high jump, qualified in the 880-yard walk, and then everybody present began to take notice.  
"Who is he?" they asked. But before they could get anybody to tell them he threw the 16-pound hammer 112 feet and some inches, vaulted 10 feet 8 inches with a pole, and then scampered home a winner over the high hurdles. He completely astonished people by winning the 1500-yard dash, and then by finding the foreman of the athletic grounds of the Park department. It was

his work in that position that enabled Sheridan to jump, run, throw weights and develop every muscle in his perfect body.  
He did not don light tops and train for weeks as most athletes do for even a single event. His method was the simplest kind. When he went to Tompkins Park to see that a sixteen-pound shot was satisfactory he looked it over by throwing it a few times, and when he went to Seward Park to inspect the running track he tested it by a half-mile run or so.  
Little by little Sheridan turned his work into practice for a feat no other man has ever accomplished. He did not do it deliberately, but by working along naturally. His peculiar method of training is not new to him, for in the seven years he has been in this country he has made a combination of work and training.  
One of his greatest feats was in breaking the world's discus record in Montreal on September 4 of last year, when he made a mark of 133 feet 6 1/2 inches.  
It happened in this way. Sheridan some weeks before procured a position as motorman on a trolley car. One day he met a friend to whom he said: "I've got just the job I want now. I tell you it's a fine practice for a man like me. All day long I swing my arm in like this, then out like that," and he illustrated his remarks by two mighty whirrs of his powerful right, while he continued: "And I'll bet that before the season's over I'll break the record in throwing the discus."  
And he did.

### GIRL DROWNED.

BRAINTREE, MASS., July 14.—While five young people were rowing on Baintree little pond this evening, the boat capsized and one of them, Jessie Brown, daughter of William Brown, of this town, was drowned. Two other girls, Annie Brown and Mary McGibbons, were held up until help arrived by Elmer Smith, while the other Fred Diate, who was a poor swimmer, managed to reach shore alone in an exhausted condition.

### "WEEKLY" CHANGED TO "TRI-WEEKLY"

The "Weekly Edition" of "The Charlottetown Guardian" was changed on July 1st to a "Tri-Weekly Edition." This was done because it is considered that the "Weekly" is too slow for a province with so many daily and tri-weekly mails as that of Prince Edward Island. In the past, four or eight pages have been printed on Friday, eight on Saturday or Monday and these twelve or sixteen pages have been held until the following Wednesday when eight more have been printed and then the entire twenty or twenty-four pages have been mailed as one paper to all subscribers. Thus the news of about two thirds of the issue is so old as to be of very little value when it reaches its destination the week following its actual publication. Now each section is mailed on Monday, Wednesday and Friday as soon as off the press. All the news is thus fresh, and each section of ads. and reading matter much more likely to be read thoroughly than if the entire twenty to twenty-four pages arrived but once a week, and all at one time. All advertisements will appear in but one section of each entire week's issue in the past, unless it is desired that they appear more frequently, in which case arrangements can be made with the management. Regular advertisements in the past have not reached subscribers the following week it was often desirable that other goods arriving in the meantime be advertised. Under the three-a-week issue "changes" received up to either Tuesday, Thursday, or Saturday at ten a. m. will be printed in either the Wednesday, Friday or Monday issue respectively, and thus reach readers when new and fresh. Transient advertisements can appear either once, twice or three a week as arranged for. It is believed that all readers will appreciate the change, as they will in future receive a paper, issued each Monday, Wednesday and Friday of every week instead of twenty to twenty-four pages issued but once a week. Advertisers very much prefer that their ads appear but once a week in a tri-weekly rather than in a Weekly of two or three times the size, as they are much more likely to be read carefully.


