**PHIBON W. AGAIN WINS FREE FOR ALL**  
 In Moncton on Saturday—Simassle and Her Driver in a Bad Mix-up—Several Records Broken.  
 MONCTON, Sept. 10.—There was good sport and some sensational finishes at the second day's racing on the Moncton Driving Park on Saturday, especially in the 2.24 class. The track was in the pink of condition and there was a large attendance of spectators.  
 Six heats were required to decide the 2.24 class. Lady Patton had been a strong favorite in the pool selling, but in the race she got only third place, winning only one heat. Cassimira won the second heat by less than a head. There was tremendous excitement and the Moncton horse was given an ovation.  
 In this class three horses lowered their marks, May Parkside from 2.25 1/4 to 2.21 1/2, Cassimira clipped a second off from 2.21 1/2 to 2.22 1/2.  
 The Halifax mare, Simassle, considering the experience she passed through, did wonderful work. While being worked out before the race she broke and was tripped by hobbles, horse and sulky turning a complete somersault. Driver Boutillier was thrown some distance and landed heavily on his arm and shoulder his right arm being quite seriously injured. Simassle had a hard tumble, but appeared little the worse of her experience.
