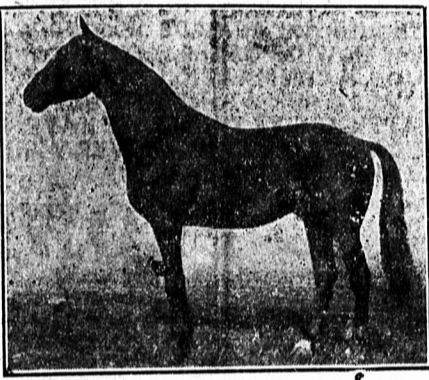

But I can only whisper this, Forget Me Not.

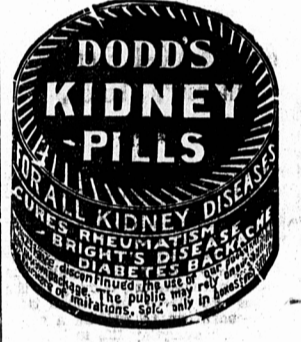
Perhaps on brighter shore when anchored some
