NEW YORK, March 27—(AP)—The stock market had little to show from a price viewpoint—for its work this week.

The general level of prices, as measured by the Associated Press average of 80 stocks, closed yesterday just about where it did last Saturday. The average was 10 cents a share higher.

Demand Saturday was highly selective and in just enough volume to keep the market on an even keel.

Rails did fairly well, along with representatives of the railroad, motion picture, aircraft manufacturing, and merchandising groups. Gains ranged to around a point although the majority of changes were in fractions.

Such issues advanced as Montgomery Ward, Woolworth, Douglas Aircraft, Lockheed, Glenn Martin, Paramount Pictures, Twentieth-Century Fox, Warner Bros., Northern Pacific, N. Y. Central, Pennsylvania Railroad, and International Paper.

Base metals showed a strong tone. Golds and western oils were mixed in a narrow range with several smaller gold issues dipping to new lows for the year.

The paper index showed a net week's gain of 11.82 or close to four per cent, while industrials rallied 2.6 points, approximately two per cent.
