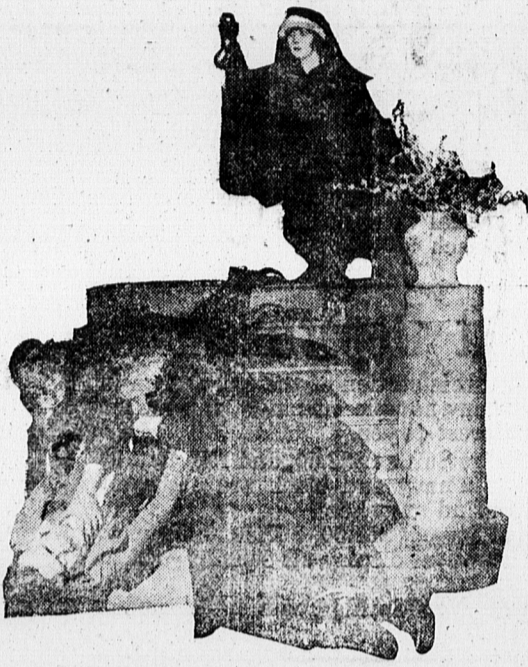

S. S. AVIATOR SAILS.—The S. S. Canadian Aviator sailed last night with a full cargo of produce, horses and cattle for St. John's, Nfld. More cargo offered than the big ship could accommodate. The cargo included 16,000 bags of oats and potatoes, 500 tons of hay, 50 sheep, 218 live pigs, 46 horses and 46 cattle. The shipping of the horses and cattle on board furnished an interesting sight for many citizens. Many of the animals showed a natural terror when they found themselves being lifted into space and some kicked the air furiously, but all seemed very placid when landed safely aboard the ship. Twenty of the horses were shipped by Mr. Donald and Wood, four by W. McNeill, Southport, six by Roberts Bros., Winsloe and the balance by Buntain Bell, and Co., John Horne and others. They were an exceptionally fine lot of animals.

Closing Exercises Of Trail Rangers. Last evening at 7 o'clock in the Y. M. C. A. Building, the "Trail Rangers" held their closing exercises for this season. The first hour was spent in writing an examination paper on "Boys of the Old Testament." This was participated in by nearly 60 boys. The second portion of the programme was made up of readings by Miss Smith, solos by Mr. Geo. Beer and Mr. C. H. Earle and club swinging by Mr. Scantlebury. Badges won in previous competitions were presented. Rev. G. W. F. Ice cream and cake were then supplied in generous fashion by the Ladies Aid, to whom a hearty vote of thanks was tendered by the boys. The meeting closed with the National Anthem.
