SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

FOURTH QUARTER  
WORDS AND WORKS OF JESUS AS RECORDED IN THE GOSPELS.

LESSON III.—OCTOBER 21.  
THE PARABLE OF THE TALENTS.  
Matt. 25: 14-30. Memorize vs. 21.

GOLDEN TEXT.  
A faithful man shall abound with blessings.—Prov. 10: 20.

Time.—Tuesday, April 4, A. D. 30.

Place.—In or near the courts of the temple at Jerusalem.

INTRODUCTION.  
The talent was an ancient weight and denomination of money varying greatly both in value and weight among different nations. The ancient Hebrew talent of gold was worth \$2,120 sterling, or about \$29,827. The talent of silver was 2100 sterling, or about \$1,938. The Attic talent was equal in value to about \$1,300; the greater and lesser Roman talents to \$500 and \$375 respectively. The talent in use in the time of Jesus was a Roman Attic talent worth 2240 sterling, or about \$1,164. It is of interest to know that the modern meaning of the word "talent," signifying mental endowments or capacities is a metaphorical use of the word growing out of the scriptural parable which forms the text of this lesson.

EXPLANATION.  
14. "His goods"—His property. Whether by these goods the talents mentioned in the next verse are meant is not quite certain. This money may have been entrusted to the servant in addition to the care of other property.

15. "Five talents"—About \$5,820. "Two"—About \$2,328. "One"—About \$1,164. In the ancient Orient slaves were often entrusted with responsible functions, including the use of large sums of money in commerce. In this case the servants were expected to use their master's money either in trade or in cultivation of the soil, that it may yield as large an increase as possible.

16. "Traded with the same, and made (them) other five talents"—In what time this increase was achieved is not mentioned.

17. "Digged in the earth, and hid his lord's money"—Buried his one talent, underestimating its worth and harboring at the same time bitter feelings against his master for not having given him more.

Doubtless he also envied and felt bitter toward his fellow servants to whom he had been entrusted the larger number of talents.

"Behold, I have gained beside them five talents more"—Of the one hundred per cent. increase or profit the servant would be entitled to a fixed portion; his compensation was on the basis of commission.

"Make thee ruler over many things"—Promotion to a position of greater trust and responsibility comes as an added reward for his faithfulness. "The joy of thy lord"—Possibly we have a hint in the preceding clause with regard to that in which this joy consisted, namely, in the sharing of responsibility and authority with the Lord himself; and if so, we have a suggestion also as to the character of the future life. This will be full of opportunity for the exercise of our highest abilities. No idle indolence, but the joy of a strong and active soul—the joy of service.

The second servant scolded the master in kind, but in degree the reward of the two differs with their capacity. (Comp. Luke 19: 17-19).

21. Then he which... came and said—"Apparently anticipating his master's rebuke and condemnation. "Reaping where thou hast not sown, and gathering where thou hast not straved"—That is, "extorting interest where thou hast invested no money." The master does not stop to dispute the servant's word, but answers him on the basis of his own complaint.

22. "Exchange"—The word means literally "those who stand at tables," because the bankers then stood at tables.

23. "From him that hath not shall be taken away even that which he hath"—The truth asserted in this verse is that talents not used passed away from the possessor, and the earnest, strenuous worker seeks to accumulate what has been wasted by his indolent.
