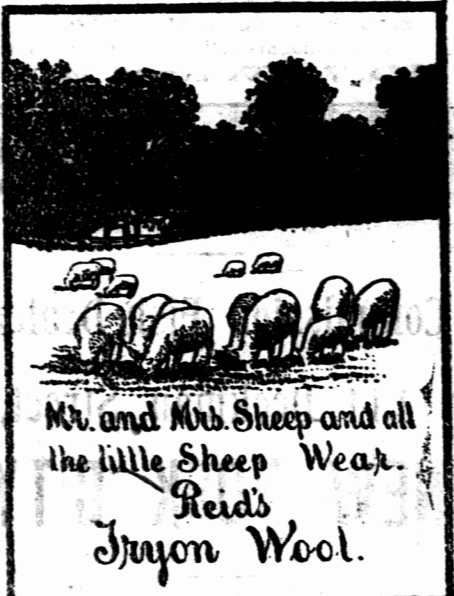

Modern Farming.
The idea may prevail that the main feature of an agricultural course is to teach boys to plow, sow and reap and to do the other familiar manual labor of the farm. Such instruction is chiefly necessary for the boy from the city who has never handled a farm tool. What the boy needs most to study is the natural sciences which underlie all farm practices. He needs to know the laws of plant life as he may study of them in botany. He needs to know the habits of insects that destroy his fruits and vines as he may study of them in entomology. He needs to know of the composition and physical properties of the soil as he may study of them in chemistry and physics. Therefore these four sciences have a large place in a course of agriculture. The student likewise needs a knowledge of English, history, civil government, mathematics, drawing, etc., that he may become a well rounded man—a good citizen as well as a handy man at his vocation. An agricultural course is one of the most delightful a person may follow. Some men say it is the best course in the universities which have an agricultural department, because it deals so intimately with the things of every-day life.—Sunset Magazine.

New Bishop of Manchester.
The Right Rev. Edmund Arbuthnot Knox, D.D., Bishop Suffragan of Coventry, has been appointed to the See of Manchester, which became vacant on November 1st by the resignation of Bishop Moorhouse. Dr. Knox, who would otherwise have been in Canada on the Moseley Commission of Education this month, is a son of the Rev. George Knox, many years chaplain to the army in India, and brother of Miss Knox of Haverall College, Toronto. A scholar of Corpus Christi, Oxford, and Boden scholar in Sanscrit. Dr. Knox took a triple first in the university, and became fellow and tutor of Merton College, Oxford. Both as a preacher and a speaker he has very considerable power, and in every movement with which he has been associated he has been marked out by his talent for organization. He has been a leader in Church work in Birmingham, and is especially connected with the promotion of religious education throughout the diocese and in the schools of Birmingham, where, for many years, he was Chairman of the school board.

Story of Mrs. Booth-Tucker.
One story told by Mrs. Booth-Tucker when a little girl of thirteen shows her to have been the true child of her parents. When walking along the shore at Portsmouth beside her governess, she saw a donkey cart being driven along furiously by a lad who was laboring the poor beast savagely. Breaking away from her companion, she rushed after it, and pulled the boy from his seat. Catching up his stick, she showered blows upon the lad's head and shoulders, with the words, uttered amid tears, "There, now, how do you like it." Perhaps her pleading proved more powerful than the blows; but in a few moments the lad was kneeling beside the donkey asking God's forgiveness for his cruelty. The climax came with the girl driving back triumphantly in the cart beside the boy, who promised henceforth to be kind and to treat his donkey well.—London Chronicle.

The Burden of the Tree.
Unfortunately a tree on a farm is often a convenient place for tying horses. Into it nails are mercilessly driven. In the crotches old hinges, horseshoes and old iron of various kinds are deposited. These are often grown over and are found later imbedded in the wood. The tree serves as a place to rest old rails against and to shelter old wagons and machinery. Trees are too often used to support wire fences instead of posts. Trees in this way are seriously injured and so riddled with iron that it is impossible to saw them into boards—in fact, they are unfit even for wood because of the axes and saws which will be injured in working them. Trees are too valuable to be used in this way. The life of a tree may be prolonged for years by giving it a little care. It is surprising the large number of trees which are thus thoughtlessly crippled or injured.—Dr. J. Gifford.

Water Guard for Sultan.
Remarkable measures are being taken for the Turkish Sultan's safety, writes the New York World Constantinople correspondent. The night guards have been doubled, as it is believed that any attack on his life which may be contemplated will be attempted at night. Another measure which the chief of the palace police has adopted is the submarine illumination of the Bosphorus in the neighborhood of the palace. An elaborate system of submarine lamps of great power have been ranged all along the landing stage in front of the palace, and both the surface and the bed of the Bosphorus are a blaze of light.

Wedded His Violin.
Sarasate, the celebrated violinist, will be sixty next year; but, though the raven curls of twenty years ago are now as white as snow, he has lost nothing of his marvellous skill. When taking his first prize at the Paris Conservatoire many years ago he received also a piece of advice, "Sarasate, my son, wed thy violin, but never a woman," and though some speak of a grave in a little cemetery near his native Pamplona, where his love lies buried, others declare that the master has simply followed out the rule given him thus early in life. At any rate he is still an eligible bachelor, who has made £10,000 a year for many years past.
